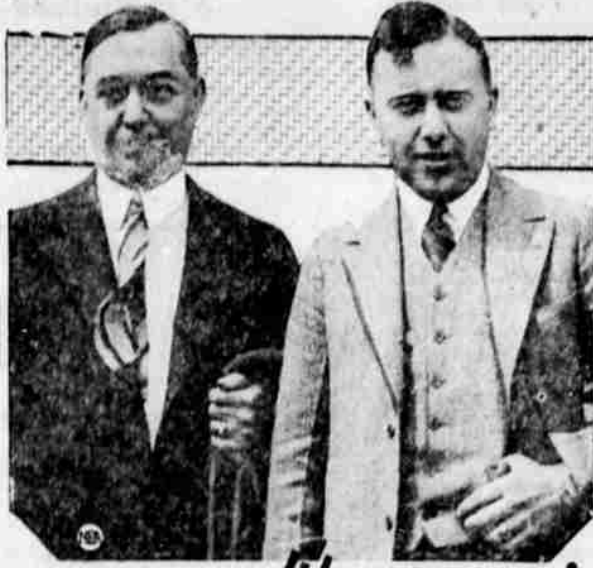

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clads appeared to be without reliable information regarding the Columbia's whereabouts.

Sighted Over Dortmund

The plane was first sighted over Germany at Dortmund, in the Ruhr valley at 4 a. m. but thereafter became a phantom ship until its appearance at Eisleben where it came to earth for fuel.

The American Ambassador Dr. Jacob Gould Schurman, and his official party, left Tempelhof field at 9 a. m. after having waited for four hours, but returned when it was reported that the Columbia was over Magdeburg, less than two hours flight from Berlin.

As soon as the landing at Klinge became known the Ambassador conferred with German officials regarding arrangements for their care, and a plane hurried off, carrying American and German officials.

Rest Until Tomorrow

This was immediately followed by a half dozen other machines bearing newspapersmen. At first it was thought the airmen would be brought to Berlin in a Luftbansa machine but later it was decided that they should be taken to Kottbus by motor and permitted to rest until tomorrow.

It was said this afternoon that it was doubtful whether the Columbia could be put into proper condition to permit of the Americans flying her to Berlin tomorrow.

Shortly after noon, when the news that the airmen had lost their way and had landed at Klinge was telegraphed to the watchers at Tempelhof field, the crowds there began melting away and in less than half an hour the great airfield was deserted.

Fogs Confuse

Despite the disappointment, the Americans were credited with a plucky and sensational flight. It was pointed out that Chamberlin encountered thick, murky weather as soon as he crossed into Germany and his failure to find the trail to Berlin was ascribed primarily to the heavy cloud banks and confusing winds.

Although a flock of scouting planes went out to locate him soon after he was sighted over Dortmund, he wandered too far to the east. Had his course been a direct one after passing over Magdeburg he could have arrived at the Tempelhof field.

Fine Camp to Be Opened at Loreman Well

Camp buildings at the site of the Southern Oregon Oil Company's well, three miles southeast of Bonanza, will contain practically all the modern conveniences of a city home, according to an announcement today by J. E. Loreman, geologist, and in charge of operations for the company. A shower bath will be installed in the sleeping quarters and a special ventilating system has been arranged so that the night crew sleeping days will not be bothered with light and at the same time receive plenty of fresh air.

Water for all purposes, will be pumped from the well at the old Kallina ranch, a distance of approximately 100 yards, to a tank of 100-barrels capacity. The tank will be located near the derrick and pipes will be run to the cook house, sleeping quarters and boiler.

"No secrecy or veil of mystery will shroud the operations at the drilling of the Southern Oregon Oil Company's well," Mr. Loreman stated. "The public will at all times be permitted to watch the progress of development."

"The derrick should be completed by the latter part of this week and the well will be spudded in between two and three weeks."

"During the past few days, numerous inquiries in regard to development activities have been received and almost daily, parties from California and other states, call at the company's offices for data and statistics relative to the geology of the district."

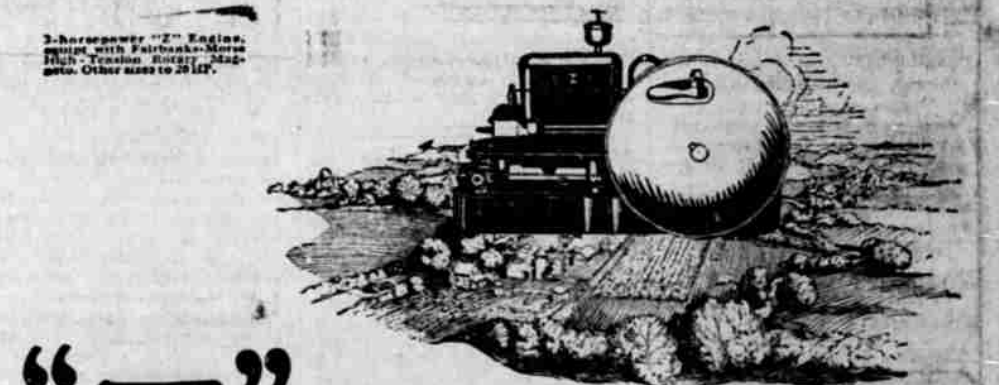
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
