SCORPIONS' CLUB BROKEN BY COPS

The police put out the fire, crawled into the tunnel and rescued Jack Sandkuhl, 12, who was spitting and choking in a smoke-filled 8 by 5 chamber at the end of the 25-foot tunnel.

It developed after some questioning that Jack was a neophyte in the order and he was undergoing the "test of smoke" to determine his fitness for higher initiatory degrees. He was to have stayed in the cave five minutes to pass the test.

SHOULD BE INTACT

If the threads of a lug bolt are stripped when changing a rear tire on the road, borrow one from the front rim if an extra lug is not carried. Every lug bolt is needed on the rear wheels, as the rim may slip when power and brakes are applied, damaging the rim and valve stem.

New World's Record In Egg Take May be Established at Lake

A new world's record in trout egg taking, will be established this year at Diamond Lake, it was estimated by M. L. Ryckman, Salem, state superintendent of fish hatcheries who left yesterday for Diamond Lake with Marion J. Barnes.

To date, 11,500,000 eggs have been taken at the Diamond Lake egg taking station, enough trout are in the trap to raise this figure to 16,500,000 and the trout are still running.

Record year for Diamond Lake—and hence the entire world, for the lake is recognized as the greatest trout egg taking station in the world—was set in 1924 when 17,000,000 eggs were taken.
