McKenzie Highway Oiling Under Way

EUGENE, Ore., June 16.—Work of oiling the section of the McKenzie highway between Springfield and Millican corners was started yesterday and all through traffic will be detoured by way of the Camp creek road and the city power plant until it is completed, according to Raymond Walsh, resident engineer of the state highway department.

The oiling was started at the upper end of the stretch and the crew will work this way. The oil is heated at the steam plant of the Mountain States Power company at Springfield and hauled to the highway in big sprinkling tanks.
