"LINDY" BRINGS FAVORITE PLANE BACK TO GOTHAM

American Hero Acts on Impulse and Hops Off To Capital After Show

NEW YORK, June 17. (AP)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh is evening clothes flew to Washington at dawn yesterday and back to bring his other half "we," the Spirit of St. Louis, to New York.

The young aviator's stunt was almost as dramatic as his hop off in the fog for Paris.

It was a demonstration of his ideas of the progress of aviation, the ease, safety and convenience with which an experienced flyer may do the seemingly impossible.

The round trip was made in less than five hours. He hopped off from here in an army pursuit plane at 3:03 o'clock and arriving at Bolling field, Wash., at 4:44 a. m. (daylight time) leaped from the plane to his beloved Spirit of St. Louis and took off again for New York at 5:09. He arrived here at 7:57.

Acts Quickly

Lindbergh was attending a midnight show at the Roxy theater, given as a benefit for the dependents of the missing French flyers Nungesser and Coll. when he apparently reached a sudden decision.

to get his plane which had been left behind in Washington due to engine trouble. Unknown to most of the six thousand persons in the theatre, Lindbergh, accompanied by Grover Whalen, chairman of the mayor's committee, and Captain R. H. Blythe, his personal representative, left the theatre at 2 o'clock and entered their automobile.

Newspapermen who had been trailing Lindbergh since his descent upon the city believed he was returning to his temporary apartment in Park Avenue and were caught unawares when his machine unexpectedly turned in an opposite direction. Lindbergh took the wheel of the car himself and soon out-distanced the reporters.

When they saw the machine heading towards the Queensborough bridge they knew he was bound for one of the flying fields on Long Island and arrived there just as he was about to take off.

Lindbergh greeted them with a broad grin. "Well," he said, "I gave you the slip that time."

He had been dressed in full evening clothes, but over this had put on a flying suit borrowed from the field commandant. He also had borrowed a helmet and goggles.

"I'll be back in time to keep all my engagements today," he called. The plane started down the field and in a few minutes he was out of sight.

After a hasty breakfast at Mitchell field Lindbergh returned to Manhattan.
