Additional Express Charges Eliminated

WASHINGTON, June 15. (AP)—After August 5, the American Railway Express Company must provide for delivering shipments of fruits and vegetables from Washington, Oregon, Idaho and California directly to the Erie Railroad pier in New York City, without additional charges for the movement across from Jersey City.

Under present conditions, the express company had required the consignee to pay \$46 per car for the transfer from Jersey City to New York. Traffic affected, the decision said, consists largely of cherries.
