that expansive territory. Notes as to routes, road conditions, hotel and camping accommodations will be sent to the proper quarters weekly by W. S. Wood, director of the tour, and this news will reach the public through the medium of newspapers, showing the possibility of touring to and through the parks in comfort and at comparatively small expense.

It was deemed fitting that so comprehensive an educational tour, the idea of which was conceived recently by R. H. Grant, vice-president of the Chevrolet Motor Company, in charge of sales, should begin at the grounds of the University of Southern California, one of the country's famous educational institutions. The car chosen for the trip, which will require several weeks, is a Chevrolet Imperial landau, the latest model of the line. From Los Angeles the Imperial landau, which bears upon its sides and its spare tire cover the painted inscription "National Park Chevrolet," will go first to Zion National Park in southwestern Utah and thence to the north rim of the Grand Canyon, stopping in passing at the newest national monument at Pipe Springs. From the north rim and the Kaibab forest the Chevrolet will visit Bryce Canyon and from there double back to Cedar Breaks, proceeding thence to Salt Lake City.

Heading eastward the car will go next to the Rocky Mountain National Park, near Denver, and from there to Glacier National Park, far up toward the Canadian line. West from Glacier the landau will travel to Rattler National Park. Home-ward bound down the Pacific Coast, it will visit Crater Lake, Mt. Lassen,

Yosemite, General Grant, and Sequoia. "A few years ago such a trip as the Chevrolet Imperial landau is undertaking would have been virtually an impossibility, even for the most expert automobile driver," said L. O. Aerna, local Chevrolet dealer. "Today it is one that even an unaccompanied woman tourist need not fear."
