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NEW PROMOTER IS SIGNED UP

Glen Le Baron, Prominent Fight Expert, Will Handle Fights in Klamath

A new era in the fight game of Klamath Falls is anticipated with the appointment by the municipal boxing commission of Glen Le Baron, prominent promoter and match-

maker of the northwest, as promoter of Klamath Falls boxing.

Mr. Le Baron has arrived and has taken charge of the situation. He will handle the Labor Day boxing card, and will probably announce a card to be staged some time late in July or early in August.

The new promoter's job is manifold: First to revive waning interest in boxing in Klamath Falls; second, to place boxing on a solid footing, far removed from any possible criticism; and third, to stage bouts that will draw fight fans from all corners of the county.

Quiet, forceful and sincere, first impression of Le Baron substantiates the many letters of recommendations

from prominent promoters, members of boxing commissions, and sports writers.

Joe Waterman, dean of boxing in the west, says:

"I have always found him very reliable, honest and a good worker, with an unusual knowledge of the boxing game and I firmly believe him capable of filling a position as manager or matchmaker for any boxers or for any club or boxing commission."

Johnny Pepe, secretary and treasurer of the Greenwich Coliseum of Tacoma writes:

"Mr. Le Baron has wide and thorough experience, having trained and handled boys as Doc Spill, Leo Lomski, Eddie Roberts."

Don Walton, sports editor of the Tacoma Ledger comments:

"I have known Mr. Glenn Le Baron for the past three years and have found him familiar with the various phases of the boxing game. I feel he would be a valuable man in the position of matchmaker."

Mayor George L. Barner of Centralia told in a letter to Le Baron's success of matchmaker in the city of Centralia and related how he had put boxing on a sound footing in that Washington city.

Other letters highly recommending Le Baron were received from H. D. Innis, member of the boxing commission of Bend, Ore.; A. E. Hall, sports writer; George T. Shanklin, organizer of the Tacoma Aerle No. 3, fraternal order of Eagles; James Mitchell, sports editor of the Tacoma Times; and Harold P. Bird, physical director of the Elks Club, Tacoma, Wash.

"There is just one way to put over boxing in Klamath Falls," Le Baron said today, "and that is to shoot square with the fans. Through

my connections throughout the northwest and my personal acquaintance with the boys who are drawing cards, I am in a position to bring real cards to Klamath Falls."

"First and foremost, I will have no connection with any of the boxers who will appear in a Klamath Falls ring. That won't go; it can't; the fans won't be behind the fights if such a practice is followed; past experience here has demonstrated that."

"If I have this country sized up right, Klamath is a wonderful fight town as long as good cards are presented, or as long as the fans know positively that they are not being double-crossed. I understand that boxing needs to be revived; well, all I can say is that if honestly, good and fast and furious fights, and fair play, have anything to do with success, the houses will be packed at the future Klamath Falls fights."
