Plowing Will Check
Possibility of Bad
Hopper Infestation

As they guide the plow over Tule lake land this fall, grain operators will know that they are accomplishing a double purpose, one in sowing a crop and the other in fighting one of the greatest potential menaces in the Klamath country—the grasshopper menace.

"Plowing up and cultivation of grasshopper egg beds is one of the most effective means of control," C. A. Henderson said last night following his return from Tule lake. "Under the five-year leasing plan, farmers can plow in the fall, and that work this year will cut down the chances for a serious infestation next year."

Heavy kills have been made on infested sections, the agriculturist commented.

CRATER ROAD IS
OPENED TO CAMPIncrease Forces In Work;
Employees of Lodge Walk
To Crater Rim

Word reached the city this forenoon that by this evening when the road snow clearing work will be stopped for the day, government camp will be reached, and that tomorrow morning the huge task by the over 40 laborers at clearing away the snow between Government camp and the rim surrounding the lodge will be resumed, while the snow plow would take up the work of clearing the Klamath entrance and other entrance roads. The Medford entrance road is all clear now.

More laborers to augment the snow clearing force were sent up from Medford today and more may be sent up tomorrow. Because of the over forty men at work at the national park now the men being sent up today, and possibly others to follow must furnish their own equipment of blankets, boots, camp utensils and food supplies, and be prepared to camp out in tents, because all the labor housing and food accommodations at the national park are now taken up.

The force of twenty officials and employees of the lodge who went up to the park yesterday arrived there at 12:20 p. m. and walked over the snow with their personal belongings to the lodge, reaching that point about two hours later, according to George O. Roberts, chief of transportation, who returned to Medford last evening.

Need Outlet From
Oregon Is Claim

SAN FRANCISCO, June 30. (UP)—Residents of the northern part of the state and the California State Automobile association are co-operating in an effort to secure the establishment of a good highway from Weed, Calif., to Klamath Falls, Ore., to connect this state with the inland empire of the Pacific northwest.

Proponents of the proposed highway state that Oregon has constructed The Dallas-California highway down through central Oregon from the Columbia River highway to the state line where it is "dead-ended" because of the lack of a California outlet.

Plans for a conference between representatives of the interested districts, the auto association, state officials, and officials of the United States forest service and federal bureau of public roads, has been called for July 20 in Sacramento by Assemblyman J. J. Murphy of Shasta county and C. C. Cottrell of the auto association highways bureau.

A SEA LION CENSUS.

EAST SAN PEDRO, Calif., June 30. (UP)—A census of the seals and sea lions on the coast of California is being conducted by Deputy Paul Bonnot of the state department of commercial fisheries.

He will cover the haunts of the seals and sea lions from Mexico to Oregon line, having already discovered new rookeries never before checked.

The census, it has been estimated, will take two years and is being conducted to determine if the seals and sea lions are becoming so abundant as to make serious inroads on the fishing industry.
