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TIN MINES TO BE EXPLOITED

Plans For New Plant At Golden Cross Told Here By Edward Erskine

First concrete step toward the exploitation and development of tin mine properties of Rogue River valley—the same mines which have aroused the interest of the nation—has been taken by the Golden Cross Mining company, financed by a group of prominent Bend capitalists, it was announced here yesterday by Edward Erskine, representative of the concern.

The forward step includes the erection of a \$10,000 plant which will produce approximately 50 tons of concentrate a day and which will soon be in operation.

The vein is four miles from Gold Hill and is one of the finest of the proven fields of that section. Owners of adjacent properties are awaiting and hoping that the development of the properties will be a success, paving the way for them.

Mine authorities from all corners of the United States have pronounced

that the Golden Cross mine holds a high percentage of tin. "Our principal trouble has been to overcome skepticism of authorities," Erskine said. "We were told time and again that there was not enough tin in the Rogue River valley. Assayers would not believe us until we literally forced our metal on them to be tested; then they became ardent supporters."

The Golden Cross vein is 3,000 feet long and from 40 to 50 feet wide.

"We do feel that there is untold treasure in Rogue River valley, and we believe that we should be given moral support."
