#### Vote Strong Against State Income Tax; Approve Registration Law

Of the 12 state measures submitted at the special election Tuesday, Klamath voters ratified 12 and turned down seven, an official count of 44 of the 46 precincts of the county revealed yesterday afternoon. The five measures approved are as follows: Negro suffrage, criminal amendment, Registration, legislators' salaries, and the Nestucca closing law. Following is the count:

### Dorothy Mackaye in Blue Denim Awaiting Sentence in Prison

LOS ANGELES, July 1, (AP)—Dorothy Mackaye, actress, started in a life tragedy today as, costumed in the drab blue denim of the jail uniform, she sat in her cell awaiting sentence for compounding a felony, following her conviction yesterday of a "cover up" attempt in the death of her actor husband, Ray Raymond.  
Sentence will be passed upon the actress Saturday. The court has the choice of giving her an indeterminate sentence of from one to three years at San Quentin penitentiary, where her avowed lover, Paul Kelly, is to serve a one to ten year term for manslaughter as a result of his tragic fist fight with Raymond, or of substituting six months imprisonment in the county jail.
