AMBITION FOR CARS SPURS ON GREAT CONTEST

Many Questions Answered About \$6,000 Herald-News Campaign

Deep-rooted in the mind of every

Already the voting has started; new nominations are arriving daily and the race for the cars will soon be on in earnest.

Inquiries have been received at campaign headquarters on many phases of the campaign and for the guidance of other contestants and persons intending to enter some of these questions and answer are given below:

Q: Must a person turn in a subscription at the same time the nomination blank is turned in?
A: It is not essential. The nomination blank alone duly records the entrant in the race with 12,000 free votes as a starter, providing it is received early in the campaign. There is no entry fee; no cost later. Upon receipt of the nomination blank full instructions on getting subscriptions and necessary supplies are mailed out.

Q: When should the first subscription be turned in?
A: Whenever the contestant chooses to do so. It is advisable to get it in early, however, as 29,000 free votes are given on the first one in addition to regular votes, during the early part of the campaign.

Q: Are only new subscriptions accepted?
A: By no means. Old subscriptions (i. e., renewals from present subscribers) are gladly accepted. Votes are issued on these as well as new ones.

Q: Are candidates allowed to get subscriptions only in the district in which they live?
A: They may obtain subscriptions anywhere—they are not restricted to their own district in taking subscriptions.

Q: When is the best time to enter?
A: Right now—at the beginning and while the 100,000 extra vote offer is on.

Q: What is this 100,000 extra vote offer?
A: A bonus of 100,000 votes will be given for every \$20 worth of new subscriptions turned in up to July 23. It's the greatest vote getting offer of the entire campaign.
