Byrd Flight Heralded Triumph For Aviation; America Fights Winds, Fogs, Mists and Rain

NEW YORK, July 7. (AP)—The voyage of the monoplane America over the storm-tossed wastes of the North Atlantic was heralded by aviators today as a triumph of navigation.

Packed tensely with drama from the start, the flight of the America was described as one of the most remarkable in the history of aviation—a successful adventure comparable to Byrd's bolt to the North Pole, and an achievement to bring new laurels to its crew of distinguished air pioneers.

Head winds, freezing and blinding fog, mists and rain fought in vain against the progress of the four men in the airplane. The battle began shortly after the take-off and did not end until the giant challenger of the elements came down.

Off Nova Scotia the America entered a wall of fog and rain from which it failed to emerge until it landed.

The fog wall extended all the way across the sea and was whipped constantly by treacherous winds.

Even as the America first passed over land the elements refused to quit. For hours the crew had been unable to see land or sea, but the fight went on. The efficiency that escorting aviators saw prevailing in the cockpit of the America at the time of the take-off was maintained over the long route.

Terse bulletins that told of a tale of danger were received throughout the flight. "Everything completely covered by fog," one message said. "Can't see wing tips," said another. "Have seen neither land nor sea for hours," a third asserted.

Over France the America described "freezing fog."

The cryptic alarm—"S O"—came from the air several times and then the America's radio became silent while the ship came down—victorious in a new epic flight of man against the elements.

Portland Worker Entombed Day and Night in Tunnel

MARSHFIELD, Ore., July 7. (AP)—Ben Bennetson of Portland, was rescued today from a tunnel at the Hauser Construction Company rock quarry on Coos river, after being entombed for 24 hours. Bennetson was drilling a tunnel underneath a rock cliff for a big charge of dynamite when a rock slide of hundreds of tons of rock shut off the entrance. More than 100 men worked steadily for 24 hours to release him. Air in the tunnel and air filtering through the rocks saved him and he was able to walk when
