



Allie Taylor Signs to Fight Frankie "Chee-Chee" Britt on Klamath Fight Card, July 20th

Self-Schooled.

Allie is a self-schooled boy in the fist racket. He has learned by the hard, hard school of trial and error. He has met the best boys the game has had to offer in the northwest. His great pulling power is a continued and relentless charging attack, a slashing offensive that knows no hesitation and that ends in a great swirl of fists as the bout draws on to a close. Allie's forte is the same that has made Doc Snel one of the greatest boxing attractions in the west—always stepping in.

Properly matched, on height, weight—he has been improperly matched at times and has suffered thereby. Allie is one of the foremost ring attractions in the northwest.

Good Match.

In Britt, Taylor has an ideal opponent. Britt is a smart fighter—smarter than Taylor—and is adept at the bobbing and weaving attack, slipping under leads and ripping to the body with mean upper cuts and body blows.

Britt does not like to back up and would rather stand toe to toe than slip and dance around the ring. When these two buzz saws meet in the center of the ring the files.

Taylor plans an invasion of the northwest fight centers in the near future but wants to hang Britt's scalp to his belt by the K. O. route. He feels that it is necessary to demand big-town shots.

Britt occupies the lime light in fist circles by taking a recent, shade decision over Joe Marcus, Portland's latest featherweight sensation. He is now in big demand throughout the north west and his friendship with Glen Le Baron, matchmaker of Klamath Falls, alone prompted him to come here on terms he has been offered, as

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Pruitt Hearing Set for Tuesday

Preliminary hearing of George Pruitt, negro, arrested Thursday night on a statutory charge, was set late Saturday by Justice of the Peace W. B. Barnes for tomorrow. Pruitt asked the court for time, stating that he had written to Portland for money to hire an attorney. He vigorously protested his innocence. The hearing will be held to determine whether or not there is sufficient evidence to bind him over to the Klamath county grand jury.

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
