Headed by the Klamath Falls Municipal band and by members of the order costumed as Igorot head hunters of the Philippines, the huge snake will crawl over Main street to Tenth and back to the Legion hall where a number of candidates will be taken captive in the Filipino jungle and tortured by the fierce head-hunters.

The Spanish Veterans Drum Corps of Portland will be an added feature of the big parade.

**Orchard Planting Must Wait Market**

PORTLAND, Ore., July 12.—(AP)—Until some organized system of marketing the fruit of the Northwest is found, it will be unprofitable to plant more commercial orchards, was the consensus of opinion in the Pacific coast nurserymen's convention here today.

The nurserymen feel they have done their work in giving the Northwest fruit trees of standardized varieties and in making the orchards of the district second to none in the world. They can go no further, it was claimed, until some marketing system is found that will allow the fruit grower a fair profit.

The convention was opened with a business session with reports from five states who are members of the group. This afternoon a general discussion was held with the main subject the problem of new commercial orchards. The annual banquet will be held tonight.
