

Welterweight Sensation to Live in City

One more boxing sensation of the northwest— attracted here by Glen LeBaron, matchmaker—has arrived in Klamath Falls to make this city his permanent headquarters.

He is Pep Webster, colored welterweight, who besides his proclivities as a fighter, has uncanny ability of developing boxers.

Webster who hails from Tacoma, was originally brought to the west by Joe Waterman, Portland matchmaker, to develop Doc Snell. In addition to bringing Snell to the peak, Webster is largely responsible for the development of Danny Matthews, Young Peter Jackson, and "One Step" Watson, a Denver boy recently matched with Pete Latzo, former welterweight champion.

Webster's first trip to the coast brought plenty of trouble to California welterweights of San Francisco and Oakland. He met Gene Cline, Mike O'Leary, Joe Roche, Hobby Bridges and other leading men of his weight who were then fighting the four round game.

Pep went over big in the Bay district and soon after locating in Tacoma, Waterman received a wire from San Francisco promoters asking for a good welterweight to box Jack Britton, then welterweight

champion of the world. Waterman offered to send Webster for \$1,000 and two tickets.

At the last moment, however, the Bay City promoters altered their plans and selected another boy.

Fought Good Boys

Webster has boxed all the northwest welter main eventers since leaving San Francisco including Bobby Harper, Young Karmen, George McCormick, Jimmy Kelly, Joe Simonich and Travie Davis.

One of his feats was to stay five rounds and two minutes with Leo Lomski at Olympia, a big feat for any middleweight, much less a small welterweight.

La Grand promoters are now seeking Pep to fight Del Allen, Oregon's latest welterweight sensation, for July 21.

May Meet Callahan

Le Baron brought the colored flash here not only as a possible opponent for Callahan, Starkey or Fugate, but also to develop Johnny Bray and Billy Austin, local boys that Pep took a great fancy to while acting as Le Baron's trainer in Tacoma.

Webster is an intelligent, courteous colored boy who is well thought of by Tacoma, Portland and Seattle fans. He will be an asset here as a main event attraction and will be very useful in developing talent.

Sought as Trainer

Harry Dillon, light-heavy champ wanted Pep to train him for a recent bout. Ted Krache recently re-tained him as trainer for his im-

portant fights with Dode Berco. Le Baron received an offer from Leo Lomski from California for Pep's services to act as trainer while Leo was preparing to meet Tiger Flowers.

Webster works every evening at 5 p. m. at the Legion hall and will act as second to Frankie Britt and Johnny Bray in the fight card to be staged here July 20.

Fans are asking for a Webster-Callahan match and Le Baron is giving the match careful consideration.
