

STUMBLE ONTO BURIAL GROUND

Skulls of Indians Unearthed Near Head of Link River By Two Men

Out in front of the fire department perches the gruesome remains of what was once an Indian brave of the Klamath basin. Only today instead of feathers, his cranium has a hat and a cigarette droops out of his mouth.

All of which is a sequel to a discovery made Saturday by Clarence Lewis and Art Bardell, who, while loading dirt on the west side of Link river a few paces from the Fremont bridge, discovered a number of skeletons, obviously an old Indian burial ground. Carefully replacing two of the three skulls unearthed, the two men saved the best skull and the object in front of the city hall is the result.

This is not the first time skulls have been located at this point. When the approach for the bridge was constructed, scores of skulls were found.

General Will Not Surrender to U. S.

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, July 18. (AP)—General Sandino, former liberal, who has been occupying American mines at San Fernando, has informed Major G. D. Hatfield, commanding a detachment of United States marines at El Ocotal, he will not surrender.

"Your communication has been received and understood," General Sandino said in reply to the demand for his surrender. "I will not surrender, and will wait you here. I want a free country, or death. I have no fear, and rely on the bravery and patriotism of my followers."

The marine detachment was reported to be proceeding toward General Sandino's headquarters, with a detachment of Nicaraguan soldiers.

100 Germans May Move to Oregon

PORTLAND, Ore., July 18. (A.P.)—Between 100 and 150 German farmers will come to Oregon, providing W. O. Bruess, Cleveland, O., their representative, can find a suitable location for them to found a colony.
