NAVAL DELEGATE NOW OPTIMISTIC

GENEVA, July 19. (AP)—"We are more optimistic now than we have been for some days," Hugh S. Gibson, chief American delegate to the tripartite naval conference, declared after a conference this morning between the six principal delegates.

"The discussions are continuing in a most cheerful and friendly atmosphere," added Mr. Gibson. "We are beginning to see more light ahead."

Mr. Gibson, however, indicated that this morning's deliberations, which were devoted to the broader phases of the cruiser problem as a whole, would have to be followed by several other sessions of the "big six" and that the harmonious spirit prevailing today did not necessarily signify rapid progress in concluding the work of the conference.

Conference Halted.
The American delegate stated that there would be no meeting of the executive committee of the conference for three or four days. This indicates that there is little likelihood of another public plenary session of the conference before next week. The question of defining the obsolescence of cruisers—determining what ships shall be counted as active units and included in the total tonnage limitation of surface craft—appears to have formed the subject of today's discussion.

Replying to a question as to whether agreement was in sight on the number of 10,000-ton cruisers carrying eight-inch guns to which each of the three powers would be entitled, Mr. Gibson said that that problem had not yet come officially before the conference and that it would be some time before it was reached.
