

HENRY CHOSEN FOR ENGINEER

**Former City Official Select-
de By County Court;
Starts At Once**

Appointment of Gene Henry as county engineer was announced yesterday by the county court. The appointment becomes effective at once. He succeeds Joseph Jensen, who submitted his resignation last Saturday.

The county court instructed Henry to assemble his surveying cross immediately and get in readiness to plunge into the road work which will be started at once. With the \$500,000 bond issue approved by the voters, much road work will be prosecuted this summer and fall. The first work to be undertaken will be the surfacing of an undesirable amount of county roads in various sections. These roads have already been graded unless the surfacing is done this year the grading work will have been lost.

Henry is former city engineer under the administration of ex-Mayor Goddard.

CAROL REFUSES TO TELL PLANS

PARIS, July 20. (AP)—Former Crown Prince Carol of Rumania, who left his villa in Neaully early this morning for a trip into the country, returned shortly before noon and was still in his home at two o'clock this afternoon.

No apparent preparations were being made at the villa this afternoon for a hurried departure and unless Carol leaves Paris by this evening he will be unable to reach Bucharest in time to attend his father's funeral.

"His royal highness regrets that he cannot see you," a correspondent for the Associated Press was told by the maid who answered the door at the villa. Only a few months ago this same maid merely said: "Mr. Carolman does not receive newspaper men."

Carol received no official advice of the death of his father from the Rumanian legation in Paris, his information coming in a telegram from Bucharest.

Friends of the former crown prince do not think that he will make an attempt to go to Bucharest at this time, especially with Jon Bratiano in power. Carol has always held that Bratiano was his arch political enemy and believes that the new premier was responsible for the decree of last year depriving him of his dynastic rights and expelling him from the country he had expected to rule.

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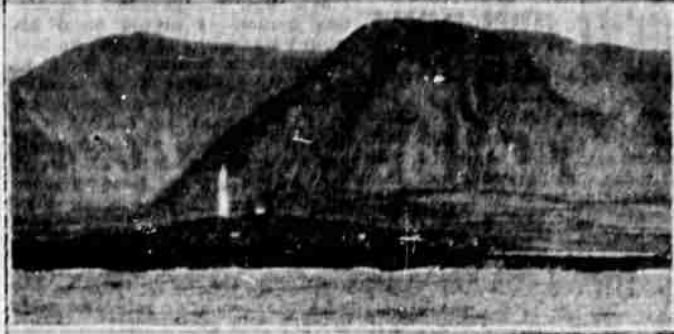
