It was not always thus. In the Rue Saint Anne the hotel of the same name was, during the war, the disciplinary headquarters of the American army for the Paris district. Here officers and men on leave or on business through Paris came to report, in and out. If their papers were not right, or they had overstayed leave, trouble was in store.

Many a soldier was escorted into the Hotel Saint Anne in those days and never got back to his outfit.

But all that has changed. Those Anne will be able to visit it now who once trembled in the Rue Saint with a smile. The hotel building, completely renovated and with all trace of those disciplinary offices removed, is now a fashionable hostelry. A meek porter, instead of a grim M. P., stands at the portal to welcome American visitors.

HINDENBURG'S PICTURE
ON POSTAGE STAMPS

BERLIN. (A.P.)—President Hindenburg's picture will soon be on millions of postage stamps. He will be the first German thus to be honored during his lifetime. Even William II was not depicted on postage stamps.

The Hindenburg stamps are to appear in connection with the festivities planned for the celebration of the soldier-president's eightieth birthday, October 2. They will be issued in denominations of 5, 10 and 20 pfennigs, but will be sold at double the face value, the difference to be turned over to charitable purposes.

Thus far the only portraits on German stamps have been those of Heinrich von Stephan, Germany's first postmaster-general, who in 1875 organized the world postal union, and political and cultural leaders of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries—Goethe, Schiller, Frederick the Great, Kant, Beethoven, Lessing, Leibnitz, Bach and Durer.
