BERLIN. (AP)—Bobbed hair and short skirts started a violent conflict within the feminine ranks of the "Stahlhelm," the German legion of war veterans.

The provincial groups of the "Koenigin Luise Bund," as the women's branch of the legion is called, were stirred to indignation by the bobbed hair and short skirts worn by their patriotic sisters in Berlin. A resolution setting forth what they regarded as the error of the Berliners' ways was promptly dispatched to Berlin.

Members of the Berlin branch, however, turned like the proverbial worm. After stressing their generous hospitality to the many thousands of war veterans at the recent "Steel Helmet" demonstration in Berlin, they withdrew from the "Koenigin Luise Bund" and formed an organization of their own under the name of "Luisebund." Abbreviated hair and skirts are not viewed with disfavor in the new "verein."

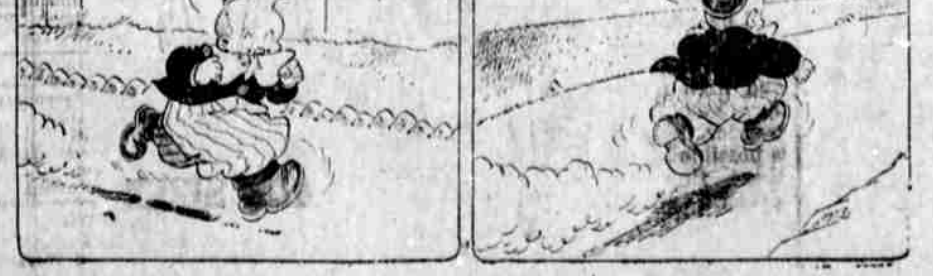
