### Slight Expansion Noted in Lumber

NEW YORK, Aug. 5, (AP)—Reports received by the National Lumberman Manufacturers Association from 348 soft wood and 142 hard wood lumber mills indicate a slight expansion of business last week, as compared with the preceding week. A nominal decrease in new soft wood business is offset by the fact that fewer mills reported last week, while 16 fewer hardwood mills reported a gain of about 20 percent in new business.

## GIBSON WRONG, JELICOE SAYS

### English Admiral Insinuates American Knew Little of Subject

GENEVA, Aug. 6, (AP)—Hugh S. Gibson, chief American delegate to the late tripartite naval conference, evidently labored under a misapprehension in making his statement regarding the value of armed merchant ships to Great Britain, Admiral Jellicoe, former commander of the British grand fleet, declared today.

This statement was made by Admiral Jellicoe when questioned by British newspapermen regarding Mr. Gibson's statements on the subject on which he referred to Admiral Jellicoe as his authority.

German raiders which preyed upon allied commerce during the world war were the type of armed merchant ships referred to by Admiral Jellicoe, not ordinary liners, he explained today.

"The converted merchant ship is for defense of trade, not attack," declared the admiral. "The German raiders were disguised

men of war. They required many months to equip as such, and their guns were carefully concealed, so that when boarded they would not appear to be what they were."

With the passing of the tripartite conference, interest here is turning toward its possible effect upon preparations which the league of nations has been making for a general disarmament conference.

Count De Clausel, France's permanent representative at the league of nations and French "S. 194.34" at the naval conference, visited Mr. Gibson today to discuss the league's disarmament activities. It is understood that Mr. Gibson told the French representative that he was heartily in favor of proceeding with the league's disarmament endeavor and that he saw no indication of any lack of interest on the part of the United States government in the work of the league's preparatory commission.

BOSTON, Aug. 5, (AP)—The Sacco-Vanzetti defense committee announced today that counsel tomorrow would go before the Norfolk county superior court at Dedham and ask for a new trial for Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti, condemned to death for murder on the ground of the newly discovered evidence.

The committee will seek a stay of execution.

BOSTON, Aug. 5, (AP)—Indications that an appeal to the United States supreme court in behalf of Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti will be made within a short time was given at the headquarters of the Sacco-Vanzetti defense committee today, although no definite announcement as to the course to be taken was forthcoming.

Members of the committee conferred with Arthur D. Hill, who entered the case as counsel for the condemned men yesterday as Wm. G. Thompson and Herbert Ehrman announced their retirement.
