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BANDIT VICTIM DIES OF WOUND

Mrs. Florence Anderson Succumbs Following Attack on Train

WASHINGTON, Aug. 26.—The death of Miss Florence M. Anderson of Los Angeles who was wounded in a Mexican bandit attack on a train south of Acapulco, Mexico Tuesday, was reported to the state department.

Miss Anderson died last night in a hospital at Mazatlan, where she had been taken for an operation, said the message, which was sent by J. Winier, lives, American vice consul there. It was not stated whether Miss Anderson had died before or after the operation was carried out. She had been shot in the left side. The bullet piercing her intestines.

Representations have been made by Mr. Ives to the governor and military authorities of the state of Nayarit, in which the attack took place, seeking the capture and punishment of the bandits, said to have numbered several hundred.
