

# PRODUCTION OF LUMBER LOWER

NEW YORK, Sept. 9. (AP)—Reports from 329 soft wood mills to the National Lumber Manufacturers association for the week ended September 3, showed decreases in production, shipments and new business, compared with reports from 346 mills the week before. The Labor Day holiday made accurate comparisons difficult. Compared with a year ago, when 23 more mills reported, there were decreases in all three items. Operations of 765 hardwood mills showed apparent decreases in all three factors compared with reports from 137 mills the week before but unit results were about the same. A year ago when 100 mills reported, there were large increases in production and new business. Unfilled orders of 219 southern pine and west coast mills were 569,348,743 feet against 609,364,921 feet for 227 mills the week before.

"But in this case habeas corpus will not in my judgment be, I can only dismiss the writ and remand the prisoner."  
**To Be Sentenced.**  
With legal authorities stating that while an appeal to the supreme court may be taken by Kelley's attorneys from the decision of Judge McMahon, but that such an appeal does not stay the execution, the probable action on the part of the state will be to insist that Kelley be brought into court immediately for sentencing. The state probably will insist that the time set for Kelley's execution be placed in the near future.  
In the meantime, James Wilson, who was to have been hanged with Kelley for implication in the same crime, is now enjoying a 30-day reprieve from Governor Patterson, dating from midnight last Friday, September 2.
