

# CARS MADE IN AMERICA SELL BEST IN EAST

DETROIT, Sept. 21.—Sutherland Pilech, representative of Dodge Brothers, Inc., in the Near and Far East, has just returned to the home office after a year's trip of nearly 50,000 miles. Mr. Pilech visited practically every city of commercial importance in Egypt, Palestine, Persia, India, Siam, Indo-China, Malay States, China, Japan and the Philippines, studying the conditions under which motor cars and trucks, particularly those manufactured by Dodge Brothers, are being marketed.

American made automobiles and trucks predominate in the countries visited by Mr. Pilech, he says, almost to the exclusion of those manufactured elsewhere. He reports that the market for American made vehicles is expanding rapidly in India, although the British, Italian and French manufacturers are making strenuous efforts to regain their one time supremacy which has been practically wrested from them by the United States.

Trucks manufactured in America enjoy a practical monopoly in India. Mr. Pilech states, except for government and municipal use. "As India is governed by England it is only natural that British trucks are used by the government," he says. "However, American trucks even have a foothold in this field, the mail contract in Bombay being serviced by Dodge Brothers and Graham Brothers vehicles."

Returning to the United States Mr. Pilech visited Hong Kong and Shanghai where all business is at a standstill because of the civil war that has been raging in China for months. China has just imposed a 20 per cent import duty which, Mr. Pilech reports, will undoubtedly still further reduce motor imports to this market.

## Woman Burned in Big Hotel Blaze

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 21. (U.P.)—One unidentified woman was burned to death in a fire which gutted a mission district rooming house here late last night.

The body of the woman was discovered by police searching the ruins after the fire.

Firemen searching the ruins of the three-story frame rooming house in an effort to learn whether there had been loss of life when it was gutted by fire shortly after eleven o'clock, failed to find the body.

The fire had spread from the first story to the roof before the fire department was called and it was impossible later to check on the occupants to learn whether or not any were missing.

## Dance Meeting Has Sinister Outcome

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Sept. 21. (AP)—A dance hall meeting two years ago between Elmer Peterson, 24, of Chicago and Kathryn Foley, 22, of Milwaukee, today had mangled the Foley home in death and had made Peterson a hunted man.

Janet Foley, sister of Kathryn was shot to death last night when Peterson, so the police were told, forced his way into the Foley house. George Foley, father of the young woman, was wounded, perhaps fatally, by another bullet when he attempted to prevent Peterson's attentions being forced upon Kathryn.

## Nun and Children Burned in Mission

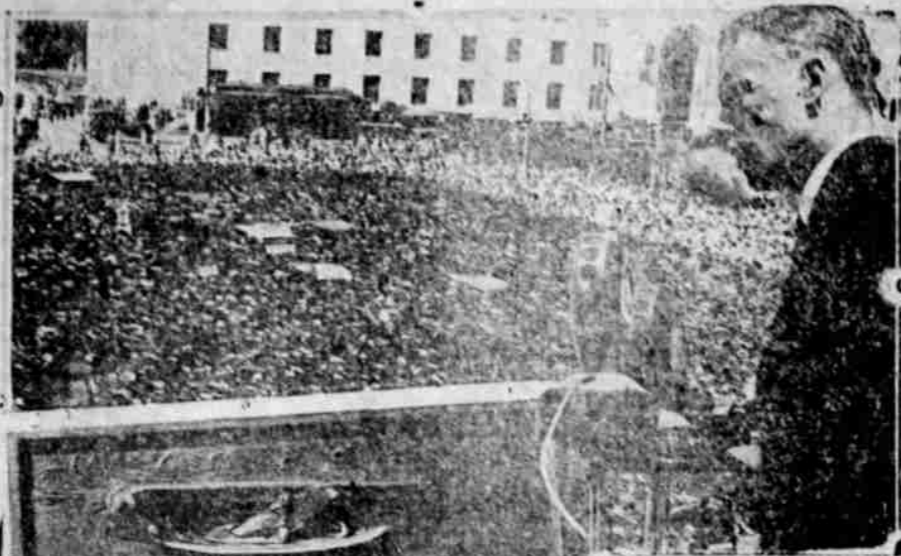

# Lindbergh Draws Thousands in His Visit to Coast



On Tuesday, June 20, 1927, at 7:30 A.M. LIEUTENANT LESLIE J. MATHIAS and LIEUTENANT ALBERT F. HEDENBERGER, AIR CORPS, UNITED STATES ARMY, TOOK OFF FROM THE OAKLAND MUNICIPAL AIRPORT ON THE FIRST SUCCESSFUL NON-STOP TRANS-PACIFIC AIR FLIGHT, ARRIVING AT WHEELER FIELD, SCHOENEL BARRACKS, ISLAND OF OAHU, TERRITORY OF HAWAII, ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 29, AT 5:29 A.M. 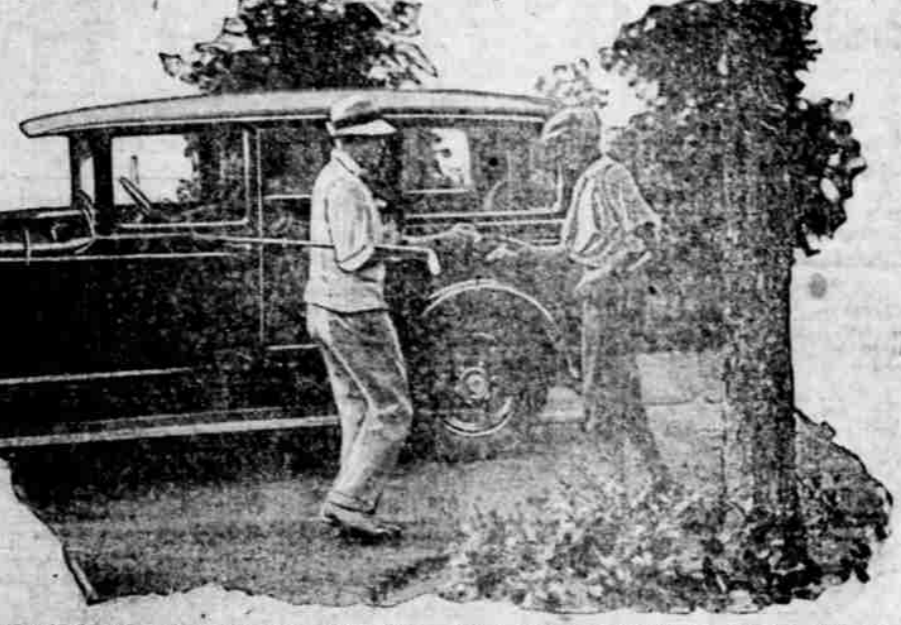

## Republican Parley Still Runs Evenly

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Sept. 21. (AP)—The republican organization under the leadership of Senator-Elect William S. Vare, apparently was still in control in Philadelphia today despite efforts of independent voters to force the party for a new order of things.

Returns from yesterday's primary election from nearly one-half of the 1,517 divisions gave the organization slate a comfortable lead, but it was far below pre-election estimates of the leaders. In the mayoralty contest, in which the fight centered, figures from 715 divisions showed that Harry A. Mackey, organization candidate, was leading J. Hampton Moore, independent, by 58,174. The vote in these divisions was Mackey 116,921 and Moore 58,757.

## Fly-Tox First in Australia

The Australians have shown by their purchases that Fly-Tox is their choice for killing all household insects. It was necessary to establish a Fly-Tox factory at Sydney in 1925. ## River Parley May Need Aid

DENVER, Sept. 21. (UP)—The U. S. supreme court will be asked to take jurisdiction in Colorado river negotiations unless the seven-state pact is ratified in the near future. Congressman Edward T. Taylor of Colorado announced today.

Taylor said he would request a suit be filed in the high court to protect upper-basin rights to Colorado river water unless the pact is signed by the seven states. While such an appeal would have no effect on the Arizona-California controversy over division of lower-basin water, the decision would establish the legal status of the present division of water between the two basins regardless of any pact, he said.

Congressman Taylor predicts a program involving flood protection for Imperial Valley is virtually sure of acceptance by congress at the next session in the light of recent disastrous floods on the Mississippi and the need of a national flood control program. Senator Hiram Johnson of California will doubtless back such a measure, he said.

## Seeks \$100,000 for Injured Reputation

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 21. (UP)—Charging that another man was falsely given credit for his work in designing sets for the motion picture "Sunrise," Rochus Gliese,

noted German art director now under contract to Cecil B. DeMille, has filed suit for \$100,000 damages against the Fox Film Corporation.

At the same time, it was said, his attorneys wired New York associates to secure an injunction to halt the world's premier at the Roxy Theater in New York.

## California Lets Road Contracts

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Sept. 21. (UP)—Contracts for nearly \$200,000 worth of highway and bridge work have been let by the California state highway commission.

The awards are as follows: For 4.33 miles bituminous topping at intervals between the west boundary of Monterey county and Camphora, to Granite Construction company, Watsonville, on a bid of \$27,892.

For 4.8 miles concrete pavements from Redlands to the southern boundary of San Bernardino county, to Maddox Brothers of Elsinore, on a bid of \$152,419.

For a concrete bridge across Wilson creek in Glenn county, to Germain and Nichols, Gerber, on a bid of \$6,639.

For 600 feet of retaining walls along Ocean Front in Ventura county, to Hall Brothers, Ventura, on a bid of \$9,918.
