She is still young and critics say she will make a great actress. She started her stage career in the chorus of the d'Oyly Carte Opera company. Always eager to get into straight plays and make a name in London, she picked small roles in several plays that were not outstanding successes. When Kathleen O'Keefe, leading lady, fell ill 24 hours before the premiere of Sean O'Casey's "The Plough and the Stars," Eileen Carey offered to take over the part, and it was then that she first met her future husband. She made a hit in spite of the short notice and has just finished her role in O'Casey's "Shadow of a Gunman." Now O'Casey is writing a special play for her, the "Red Lily," which will be produced soon after their honeymoon.

HANNA'S GIRL SEEKS SEAT IN U. S. CONGRESS

CHICAGO, Oct. 13. (AP)—Miss Hanna's daughter has followed her parent's path. She will run for public office. Announcement of Mrs. Medill McCormick that she will seek the republican nomination as Illinois congress-at-large, climaxes a long career in politics that began when "Hanna of Ohio" was called "the president maker." She will undertake her campaign with the same vigor that characterized the career of her father, a figure of legendary power in politics. She has announced she will stump every Illinois county in an effort to win the nomination at the primary next April. At present republican national committeewoman from Illinois, Mrs. McCormick for years has been an active worker in the ranks of her party. She will seek the office on the record of her republican party participation. "Believing, as I do, that every American citizen who can ought to perform some sort of public duty," she said.
