Borah of Idaho, Brookhart of Iowa and Frazier of North Dakota, as busy working out a new farm relief bill which they hope will be acceptable to Senator Borah, an opponent of the vetoed McNary-Haugen measure. The new bill will eliminate the controverted equalization fee provision which met the disapproval of President Coolidge and of Senator Borah as well.

However, the ranks of the new organized block are not increasing. Senator McMaster of South Dakota has been here but all other commissioners in session here, today urged that a flat per ton charge be applied on all traffic moving throughout the various districts.

TOO MUCH GREASE BAD  
FOR THE TRANSMISSION

It is poor practice to fill the transmission case to the brim with heavy oil in an attempt to silence the noisy growl from the gears. Too much grease in the transmission is likely to make the gears almost as noisy as too little. The better way is to fill the case to the level of the countershaft.

CLEAN OIL STRAINER

The oil strainer is the most common cause of trouble in the lubricating system, and it is advisable to remove the strainer about every 2,000 miles for cleaning.

The army three days. Mr. Coolidge declared, speaking of the Gettysburg battle. "His victory becomes the more powerful."

The more we study the history of the war in which he fought the more General Meade stands out as a responsible and reliable commander. Others may have had more dash, though none surpassed him in courage.

"He did not engage himself in leading hopeless charges. He was, rather a general who kept himself sufficiently informed as to the movements of his enemy and made such preparations and wise disposition of his own troops that hopeless charges were not necessary. It cannot be said that he always won, but he experienced very little defeat."

"His personality was well rounded out. It appeared to possess no lofty peaks. It was not marred by any deep depression. If he was some times quick of temper he was eminently sound of judgment. He was a solid, substantial man, one who inspired confidence, one who could be trusted."

- The following 10 tips to motorists who would avoid automobile fatalities were issued at the National Safety Congress in Chicago by Walter G. Gings of New York, president of the National Safety Council:
- 1: Obey traffic signals, rules and commands of traffic officers.
  - 2: Go slow passing children and vehicles around street corners; approaching street crossings.
  - 3: Never forget skid chains.
  - 4: Equip the car with a bumper.
  - 5: Stop at railroad crossings and behind street cars.
  - 6: Give warning signal of approach—keep to the right.
  - 7: Be cautious of automobiles, horses and buses.
  - 8: Be sure brakes are in working order.
  - 9: Cross street only at regular crossings.
  - 10: Have headlights lighted at night.
