

McCrary Batters Way to Stardom As Fleet Fullback

(ATHENS, Ga., Oct. 21. (AP)—A smashing half-driving attack, the kind of offense that has brought fame to Herd McCrary, an Indiana boy, playing his second year as fullback for the University of Georgia Bulldogs.

McCrary has 127 pounds of raw muscle over six feet of height, which he uses to tear through opposing lines, while a set of lightning feet are capable of taking him around ends at a speed of ten seconds to the hundred yards.

In fact he depends upon his strength and speed for spectacular gains rather than the tricks of side-stepping and slipping.

Once during the Florida game last season he charged the forwards from the opposing six-yard line and when he landed on the touchdown three Florida boys were sprawled unconscious around him.

McCrary ran wild when Georgia met the University of Virginia, traditional rivals this season, scoring four touchdowns, one each quarter. Once he intercepted a pass and ran 47 yards through the whole team across the goal line. He was on the receiving end of most of Georgia's passes, while his line smash and end runs helped put the all in a scoring position. Georgia won, 33 to 10.

In the recent Yale-Georgia game he gained 100 yards through the touchdowns that gave Georgia a 14 to 0 victory, he had a consistent ground game and saved the victory for his team in the last few moments of play by stopping Caldwell of Yale. McCrary was described as a "top-notch" battering ram of Yale.

Experts hail him as one of the leading candidates for the All-American and possibly higher honors, if he continues his spectacular performances.

Fast Basketball Promised Klamath

In the event the "Oregon Hawks" basketball team from Portland, reputed to be among the fastest on the Pacific coast comes to Klamath Falls, local fans will have the opportunity of seeing some professional basketball this winter. Games with the University of Oregon, Willamette College and the Oregon Southern Normal College are under tentative arrangements for the December booking. It is understood that the preliminary workouts will start along the middle of November. At least three men of national fame from Chicago will be on the squad, according to present plans.

JAI ALAI NEW SPORT.

(CHICAGO, Oct. 21. (AP)—Mayor William Hale Thompson, who brought Chicago its first heavyweight championship boxing match, is the unofficial sponsor for the introduction here of a brand new sport, jai alai, pronounced "ai-lai."

Jai alai is the national sport of Spain and several other Spanish speaking countries, notably Cuba and some of the South American republics.

It follows somewhat the lines of tennis and handball, or racquet, except that the players wear a cesta, or basket, on their throwing hand, and it partakes of the speed of those games. A jai alai stadium is being built close by one of the most popular north side cabarets, whose proprietors are the financial backers of the project.

It is planned to bring forty players, recruited in the Basque provinces of Spain, here for the winter. Bonds will be filed with the immigration authorities to cover their proposed stay of six months. They will arrive about December 15.

Detroit Loud in Praise for Billings

Besppectated Youth is a Pitching Protege Of Jean Dubuc, Former Tiger Moundsman

Better pitching is the slogan of Manager George Moriarty of the Detroit Tigers. His team finished in the first division this year because, on the whole, the Tigers' staff of pitchers showed improvement.

In J. J. Billings, called "Josh" by his teammates, Moriarty feels confident he has added a youngster to his staff destined to shine in the majors.

It is an unwritten law in baseball that all Weavers are known as "Buck," players with the name of Young are called "Young" while "Josh" is invariably tied on to any player who answers to the name of "Billings." Hence the nickname, given him as soon as he joined the minors.

This chap "Josh" Billings is unusual in that he is a high-brow, mentally, and wears spectacles, a la Lee Meadows and Carmen Hill, pitching stars of the Pittsburgh Pirates. Billings was educated at Brown University.

Older fans, who recall Jean Dubuc, a star of the Tigers' pitching staff a dozen years back, will note a great similarity between the style of young Billings and the veteran Dubuc. And it is only proper that the resemblance should be most striking, since it was Dubuc as coach at Brown University, who instructed Billings in the art of pitching.

When Dubuc, who acts as scout for the team on which he once starred, sent Billings to the Tigers, he expressed the belief that the youngster was capable of making the grade without any minor league experience.

Taking Dubuc at his word, Manager Moriarty put Billings to the acid test a few days after his arrival in Detroit. He beat Boston. A lot of pitchers have done that the past year, so his win over the lowly tallenters caused no undue amount of excitement. Football Fundamentals



There have been few great big league baseball clubs that lacked stars of short and second. In like manner, much of a football team's success hinges on the play of the tackles. Much of the grid play pivots around them.

A good tackle must be feet of foot. The biggest, fastest and strongest lineman is invariably used as defensive tackle.

It is customary for two or more players of the offensive team to be delegated to keep the defensive tackle out of the play when the ball is sent into his territory. The tackle is responsible for the area between his position and that of his end.

Strong forearms, wrists and hands are invaluable to a defensive tackle. Most good tackles on defense usually stand fairly high before the ball is put into play. The arms are extended, but not so far as to encroach on the neutral zone between the two lines of scrimmage.

The defensive tackle stands high because he must get a good view of the offensive backs, thereby enabling him to see what happens to the ball and permitting him to adjust himself to existing conditions.

When the ball is passed, he carries his opponent and charges straight through him without deviating an inch to left or right. To do otherwise would leave a hole for the ball carrier to slip through.

The two defensive tackles are the players expected to block all kicks possible and rush the forward passers in the hope of spoiling the play by making for inaccuracy on the part of the punter or men handling the ball.

If the defensive tackles fall in their duty, it leaves the offense plenty of time to get off its kicks and passes and makes such plays practically unstopable.
