PALE ALTO, Calif., Oct. 29. (AP)—Ready to "shoot the works" against Stanford, Coach John J. McEwan's Oregon University squad took the field against the big red team today with the announced intention of playing a wide open game featuring a pair of negro backs, Bob Robinson and Charlie Williams. Coach "Pop" Warner of Stanford, apparently holding the northerners in no little esteem, was ready to send his first string onto the gridiron to open the game.
