



'2 TEAM' PLAY BEHEMOTHS TO WILL BE TRIED MEET TONIGHT

Western Conference Col-
leges to Have Active
Second Teams

Larry Holman and Nails
Gorman Will Clash In
Chiloquin Ring

CHICAGO, Dec. 6. (AP)—The two team football system, long talked of both in the western conference and in other sections, is to become a reality in the big next fall, with Michigan taking the initiative. Iowa also has announced definite plans for a second team.

Fielding H. Yost, director of athletics, and Dr. Clarence Cook Little, president of Michigan, have announced that games for the second Michigan team are being sought among both conference and non-conference schools. As most conference teams have completed their 1928 schedules, and only Iowa has yet indicated any intention to follow the Michigan system, the two teams will be rated as first and second for the 1928 season, the Michigan authorities said, but eventually they are to be developed into two teams of equal power.

The "two team" plan is a fine thing for schools with big under-graduate enrollments. A. A. Stagg, Chicago, dean of the big ten colleges said, but not for him. The system has its advantages in giving opportunities for students to play. Stagg said, but with a small enrollment he was sure he wouldn't have enough material to put a second team in the field next fall.

ISH HATCHERY HIT BY FLOOD

Fed by heavy downpours of rain, Cherry Creek—a tumbling, fast flowing little stream on the west side of Klamath lake—rose to flood heights and carried away a fish hatchery dam at Cherry Creek Haven, according to word received here yesterday. Loss was estimated at \$5500.

That hatchery was to have been completed in the near future and the fish for the new fishery were to have arrived December 15. Breaking of the dam will postpone the construction for a year.

New Building On Fifth Will Be Built Soon

Formal announcement of the construction next spring of a \$50,000 Masonic temple on the corner of Fifth and Pine streets, was made last night at a meeting of the fraternal order at which the final payment on the building site was celebrated.

With a property of nearly one-quarter of a block in dimensions, plans have been drawn for the erection of a two story building, with full basement. The first floor is designed for club rooms, dance hall and general social rooms while the second floor will be utilized as a big fraternal hall.

The building committee is composed of E. E. Magee, Marion Hanks, Robert Watterson, C. E. Dennis and Oscar Smith. Work on the building will probably begin next May. The property occupies the southwest corner of Fifth and Pine streets.

Algoma Man in Severe Crash; On Siskiyou

ASHLAND, Ore., Dec. 6.—Albert Berglund, of Algoma, Oregon, narrowly escaped death or serious injury shortly before midnight Friday when his Star touring car was wrecked and hung over the edge of a 100-foot drop near Siskiyou Camp, near the summit on the Pacific highway. Berglund was taken into custody by Federal Officer Terry A. Talbot and Officer Sam Prescott, when enroute to Ashland, having been picked up by a passerby as he started to walk toward Ashland after the accident. According to officers Berglund was in an intoxicated condition and a half pint of liquor was found in his possession.

Berglund was fined \$100 and costs by Justice of the Peace L. A. Roberts Saturday when he entered a plea of guilty to a charge of drunkenness filed against him by Sergeant C. P. Talbot.

Pine Holdings Of Indians to Be Protected

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 6.—The bureau of Indian affairs has adhered strictly to the policy of disposing of reservation timber only as the interests of the Indians may require. Hubert Work, secretary of the interior, states in his annual report.

"Two comparatively small units were offered on the Klamath reservation, Oregon, to facilitate the cutting of isolated tracts that were directly adjacent to other areas from which the timber had been sold," he reports. "The prices received were exceptionally high."

"The bureau declined to offer large tracts on the Colville, Wash., Fort Apache, Ariz., Klamath and Warm Springs, Ore. reservations, maintaining that existing sales on those reservations were sufficient to meet all needs for funds and that economic conditions in the timber trade and sound principles of forest management did not justify further large offerings."

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FANS SEEK LEGAL MAN ON MAN-MADE STATUE

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Dec. 6. (AP)—A proposed ordinance here would declare a public nuisance any electrical equipment radiating waves detrimental to radio reception. The bill, twice read before council, has been approved by Mayor Charles E. Moyer, himself a radio enthusiast, and by the lighting and public utilities committee.

The bill provides that all equipment which "radiates electrical waves of such lengths as to disturb radio reception between 7 and 11 p. m." must be removed or repaired within five days after complaint has been made to police, or the owner will be subject to a fine of \$25 on first conviction and \$50 on the second.

The complainant, under the bill, would be expected to supply officers with information as to location of the objectionable equipment. Opponents of the measure say difficulty might arise from efforts of "leak hunters" to invade a man's home in search of interference. They also argue enforcement would be impossible.

Mayor Moyer says he sees "no reason why the ordinance should not be passed."

FRENCH LOUDSPEAKER HAS MANY DISGUISES

PARIS, Dec. 6. (AP)—The French housewife's fight against nightish loudspeakers is causing markets to disguise them in all sorts of artistic ways.

The sounds of the radio set loose from a small marble fountain in a corner of the room in one radio set put on the market in France. A reading lamp in another form, the diffuser disposed horizontally, but hidden by the silk shade, while the open book form is becoming more and more common.

SPRING IS MEMORIAL TO RED CROSS HERO

COLUMBUS, N.Y., Dec. 6. (A.P.)—A memorial to Earl Kilpatrick, Red Cross director of reconstruction who lost his life during the Mississippi flood, has been designated in the new town-site of Columbus.

Flood waters of the mighty river have driven this little town from its place by the Mississippi to a site on a nearby bluff, and here is a clear, cool spring which has been selected as the Kilpatrick memorial. A bronze tablet is being prepared to mark the tribute.

Kilpatrick was killed in an airplane crash while on a trip over the flood district last May.
