# MINORITY GIVEN TWO SERIOUSLY CHAIRMANSHIP HURT IN CRASH

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13. (AP) Senate republican committee assignments dealing out important chairmanships to several of the western members were approved today by a republican conference. New committee chairmanship assignments go to Senators Norbeck, South Dakota, Bankluz and currency; Nye, North Dakota, public lands; McNary, Oregon, agriculture; Howell, Nebraska, claims; Shoveridge, California, privileges and elections, and Good, Pennsylvania, military affairs.

Assignment of Senator Nye, one of the leaders of the western independents, to the important public lands committee was made possible by the advancement of Senator Norbeck to the banking and currency committee, which Senator McLean, Connecticut, voluntarily relinquished. The old chairman of the "big five" committee held over, including Senator Warren, Wyoming, appropriations; Smooth, of Utah, finance; Borah, Idaho, foreign relations; Norris, Nebraska, judiciary and Watson, Indiana, interstate commerce.
