which takes in the executive secretary at \$2400; stenographer, \$1200; information bureau \$1020 and janitor \$240, already \$3535 has been used. The budget allows \$6060 for the year.

Taking in quarters which includes rent, heat, electricity, garbage, repairs and decorating an expenditure of \$991.67 has been made with a total allowance of \$1700.

Office expenses which takes in postage, telephone, office supplies, printing, incidentals shows \$1429.24. The years total allows \$2467.27.

Headed under miscellaneous comes notes payable, interest, travel, dues to the United States and state chamber of commerce as well as uncontrollable expenses which totaled \$1195.04 for the seven months. The budget allows an expenditure of \$201.50 for the year.

For the remaining five months \$3,038.25 remains. An outstanding service total of \$1342.50 was shown in the report.

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Shanghai stated four Russians are on staff of Canton "red army" and declared that soviet influence was behind the Canton movement.

A "soviet government" was set up Sunday in Canton for the province of Kwangtung, refugees reported. The moderate national government at Nanking was denounced by communists in violent posters in Hankow with indications the nationalist commander there might switch to the communists. Between thirty and forty refugee missionaries, mostly Americans and Germans, arrived at Hongkong from Canton.

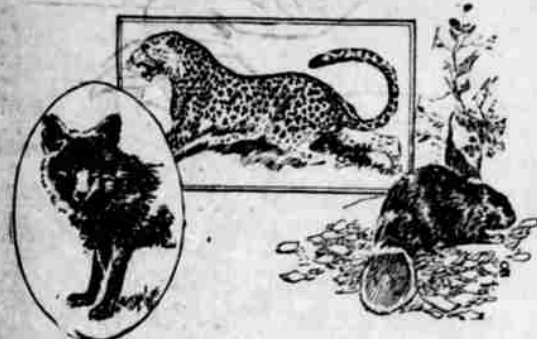
