J. GLICK LOSES ON LOW BLOWS

Tod Morgan Outpointed By Challenger Until Foul Blow Struck

NEW YORK, Dec. 17. (AP)—Tod Morgan of Seattle was still king of the junior lightweights today but only after a torrid battle with Joe Glick, Brooklyn challenger, who was disqualified on a foul in the 14th round of a 15-round bout.

Meeting for the second time in little more than a year, Glick carried a savage punching attack against the champion in Madison Square Garden last night and had piled up a big advantage on points when Morgan was awarded the decision on account of a low blow.

Glick had been cautioned on several occasions to keep his punches up. Glick floored Morgan three times and on each knockdown, Morgan complained of low blows but his protests were not allowed.

Izzy Schwartz of New York, qualified for recognition as flyweight champion of the New York state athletic commission by receiving a decision over Newboy Brown of Sioux City in a 15-round semi-final.

MEDFORD, Dec. 17. (AP)—Pat Padelford of Roseburg, scheduled to box Stanley Stewart of Portland here last night, balked at entering the ring because of a slim attendance, whereupon deputy sheriffs served a warrant upon him charging bootlegging and took him to the county jail. Joe Gorman of Grants Pass took Padelford's place in the ring, the match resulted in a draw. Sailor Jack Woods threw Wild Bill Donovan in two straight falls in a wrestling match.

PORTLAND, Dec. 17. (AP)—Mrs. Violet Jensen, 21, was found dead in a bath tub by her room mate, Miss Alice Delore at their room in the Laurel hotel early today. Mrs. Jensen has been subject to epileptic fits and officers believe she had been seized by such a fit while bathing and drowned. Efforts to resuscitate her by artificial respiration failed. Mrs. Jensen was separated from her husband, whose address was unknown to her friends.

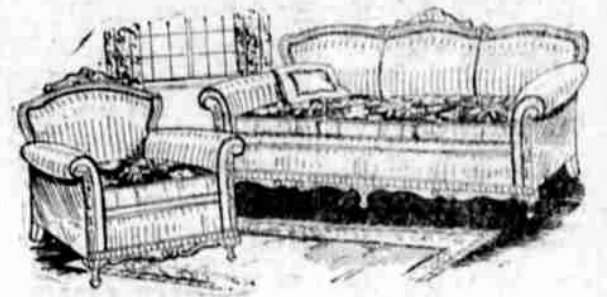

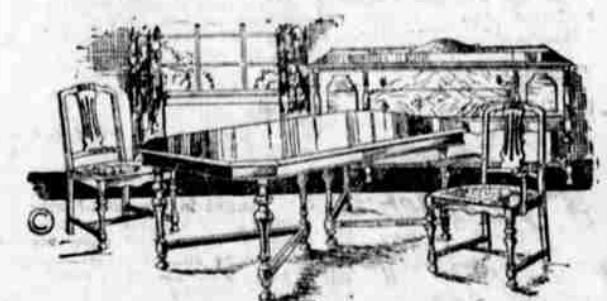
