

FIEND STILL AT LARGE; POLICE PURSUE

LOCATE NO TRACE OF SUBMARINE

Divers Fail to Find Sunken Under-sea Craft This Afternoon

HAD DRIFTED AWAY DURING BAD STORM

Officials Are At Loss to Know What to Do Under Present Situation; Cable Snaps as Wind-swept Sea Rises and Falls; Ocean Is Now Calm.

PROVINCETOWN, Mass., Dec. 21. (AP)—Admiral Frank H. Brumby, in charge of salvage operations on the sunken submarine S-4, announced late today that the wreck had been lost, because a line attached to it was torn away in the recent gale.

Two divers who were lowered today failed to find the vessel upto 4:15 o'clock.

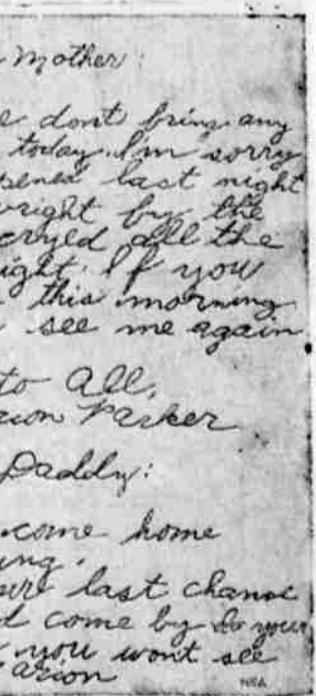

REED EYES CHAIR OF PRESIDENT

Fiery Senator from Missouri Opens Way for Supporters

WILL NOT RUN FOR SENATE THIS TERM

Room for Prominent Senator Gets Under Way; Recognized a Powerful Man in Democratic Party and One Who Must Be Reckoned With.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21. (AP)—"Clearing the way to those who are seeking for him the democratic presidential nomination, Senator Reed of Missouri, has decided that he will not again run for the senate.

The senator's position, set forth in a statement by Samuel W. Fordyce, chairman of the Missouri democratic state committee, makes it clear that while he himself is not seeking the nomination, he is aware that his friends are doing so in his behalf.

Chairman Fordyce issued his statement after a conference with the senator and declared he made it public "because of persistent rumors, started presumably by certain metropolitan newspapers, that Senator Reed is not seeking the nomination for president."
