State Highway Commission Suggests Use of Chains on Many Southern Oregon Roads

Use of chains on many state highways in central and southern Oregon is strongly advised by the state highway commission in its weekly report on road conditions throughout the state.

Following is a partial report including state highway within and contiguous to Klamath:

Roosevelt Comm Highway, Coos and Curry Counties — Lakeside-North Bend; Macadam. Ferry across Coos Bay. North Bend-Matfield-Coguille; Paved. Coquille-Bandon - Port Orford - Gold Beach-Brookings-California State Line; Macadam. New ferry at Rogue River in operation.

Coos Bay-Roseburg Highway — Pacific Highway-Camas Valley-Myrtle Point-Coguille; Macadam.

McKenzie Highway — Eugene-Belknap Springs-Sisters-Redmond-Bend; Macadam. McKenzie Pass closed on account of snow between Alder Springs and Sisters.

Central Oregon Highway — Bend-Burns; First 12 miles macadam, balance fair dirt road.

Chains advised. Burns-Crane; Macadamized. Crane-Vale; Rough but passable, chains advised. Make local inquiry regarding snow conditions.

Ochoco Highway — Redmond-Prineville-Mitchell; Macadamized and in good condition. Mitchell-Antone-Dayville; Dirt road, rough but passable. Chains required. Make local inquiry at Mitchell and Dayville as to snow and mud conditions.

Crater Lake Highway — Medford - Trail - Prospect; Macadam. Prospect-Union Creek-South boundary Crater Lake National park. Closed by snow. South boundary Crater Lake National park-Fort Klamath Junction; Macadam.

Klamath Falls-Lakeview Highway — Klamath Falls-Bonanza; Macadam. Bonanza-Lorentz Mills; Old road, rough, chains advised. Lorentz Mills-Healy; Macadam.

Beatty-Hy; Graded roadbed, very rough. Chains advised. Hy-Drews Valley; Old road, rough, and passable but must have chains. Drews Valley-Lakeview; 25 miles macadam.

Fronton Highway — Bend-Lakeview-Silver Lake-Summer Lake; Partly macadamized, balance unimproved dirt road. Chains advised. Very rough and muddy.

Summer Lake-Paisley; 9 miles macadam, balance fair dirt road. Paisley-Lakeview; Macadam.

Lakeview-New Pine Creek-California State Line; Partly macadamized, balance fair dirt road.

Ashland-Klamath Falls; High

way — Ashland-Klamath Falls; Macadam, fair condition.

Redwood Highway — Grants-Pass-Kerry-Deer Creek; 4 miles oiled macadam, 11 miles new construction in fair condition, 6.5 miles good macadam, Deer Creek-California State Line; 21 miles oiled macadam.

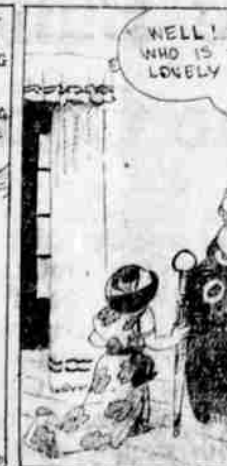
