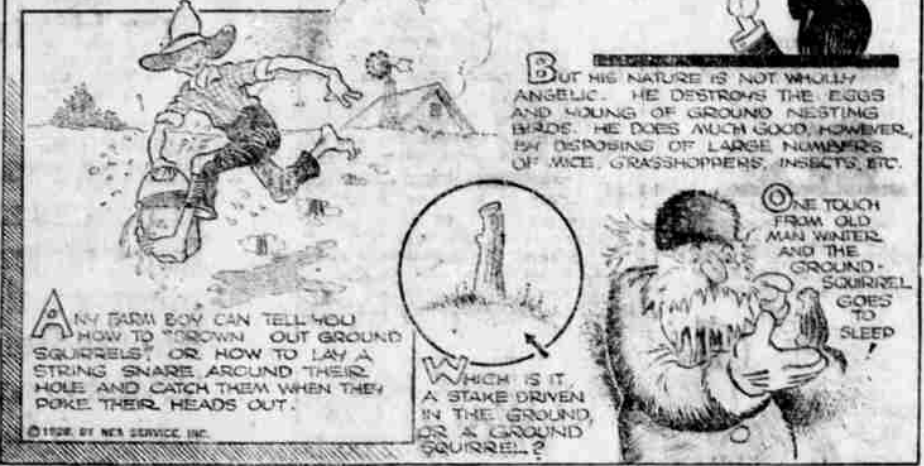

## EUROPE FEELS EARTH SHOCKS

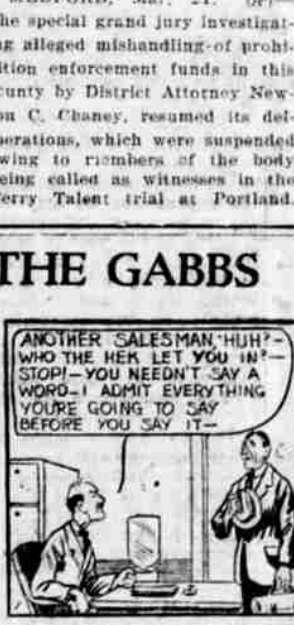
BELGRADE, March 21. (AP)—Earth shocks were felt at Sareb and in the neighboring country at 1 a. m. today.

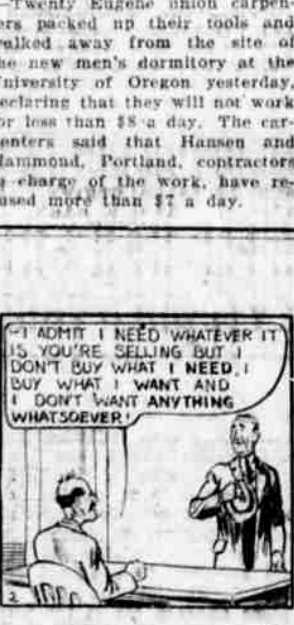
