

Sailor Jack Woods Flattens Henry Burke, 2 Out of 3 Falls

In one of the cleanest and probably most entertaining sporting events staged in this city for many months, Sailor Jack Woods of Medford twice pinned Henry Burke, Polican City grappler, to the Scandia hall mat Thursday night to win the first of a series of elimination contests promoted here by A. McDuffie.

The bout was exciting from the opening going and while the wily wrestler from Polican City once tried to get a hold with his teeth and the sailor occasionally used an elbow attempting to find a spot in Henry's ear not already cauliflowered, the main event go was noticeably clean.

After more than a half hour

of herculean labor, during which all the holds known to the scientific sport of grappling were grabbed only to be broken, Burke put his opponent's shoulders to the mat to win the first fall.

The second fall, which went to the Medford wrestler, came in less than 15 minutes to end a bout more strenuous than the opener. The last go was equally short and was won by Woods through skillful manipulation of the excruciating toe hold.

The sailor, after narrowly squirming from several near-winning holds in the arms of the powerful Burke, caught a toe clinch which pinned the Polican down for nearly two minutes. Burke managed to escape this however, and leaped to his feet.

Unfortunately for him, Woods grabbed a similar hold almost at the next down and this Henry was unable to break. He struggled valiantly but at last relaxed his bulging muscles to pat the mat in the sailor's favor.

Woods went into the ring weighing 174, Burke 167 pounds. This was Burke's first go in the light heavyweight class.

A large crowd which quickly entered the spirit of the sport and kept to its feet in frenzied cheering as the mat gladiators threw each other about the ring, attended the wrestling card. Everybody left proclaiming it as good a show as Scandia hall has ever housed.

In a flashy, action-crowded semi, Lefty Challis, city, took two out of three falls from F. Way, husky youth from the Bonanza country. The bout was a fitting introduction for the main event, and the outcome was ever in doubt. Lefty took the first fall, Way the second only. The former weighed in at 154, the latter at 155.

This bout was the first of the series to decide the county wrestling championships.

In the newsboy's championship series, first bout, Roy Little defeated Richard Clauson with two out of three falls. The boys were 125-pounders and the winner was challenged by Red Banks, in the same division.

Seattle Negro Keeps Up Hard Marathon Pace

LUPTON, Ariz., Mar. 23. (A. P.)—Ninety-six runners in the Los Angeles-New York cross country marathon, pushed forward today from here toward their 21st control station at Gallup, N. M., a distance of 26 miles. Stepping across California and Arizona the derbys have left 686 miles of their 3400 mile jaunt behind them.

Thursday's lap in the marathon ended in a tie between Ed Gardner of Seattle, and Seth Gonzales of Denver. The two runners jogged into Lupton from Navajo, Ariz., completing the 24.7 mile run in five hours, 9 minutes and 30 seconds. For the 686 miles from Los Angeles the elapsed time for the two runners were: Gardner 131:29:16; Gonzales 146:17:57.

Other early finishers Thursday

were Oli Wantinen, New York, 5 hours 12 minutes 30 seconds; Arne Suominen, Detroit, Mich., who finished yesterday's lap in 5:45:15, now leads the van with an elapsed time of 118 hours, 36 minutes. Runners who finished the run from Navajo Thursday included Allan Carrier, Grants Pass, Ore., 6:30:30.

KLAMATH 5TH IN STATE FOR CONSTRUCTION

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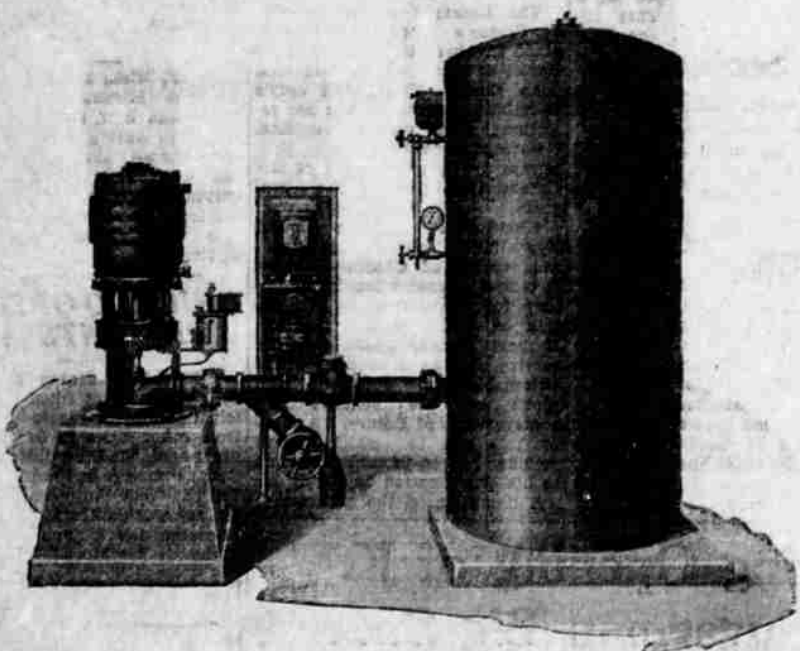
BOWLING TEAM OF EUGENE MAY ENTER TOURNEY
