Klamath Crop Demonstration Work for 1928 is Under Way

A most important agricultural development work—that of crop demonstration—has been launched by Wray Lawrence, assistant Klamath county agent, in an attempt to find just what ingredients various Klamath soils need for highest percentage of productivity.

Demonstration work of the agriculturist this year will be confined to fertilization experiments. Lawrence stated yesterday several of which have already been started.

Four demonstrations are planned for the county this year, involving fertilization of various types of soil and different major crops of this basin.

One of the most important of these is the experiment with fertilizer on sagebrush land, cropped this year for the first time, on the Chapman ranch at Malin. Here two and a half acres are being fertilized with a view to increasing their yield.

A similar experiment is to be conducted on alfalfa on the Burk

ranch at Pine Grove, while on the G. A. Nishelm truck farm various vegetables will be grown with and without certain fertilizers with a view to increased yield.

A more extensive demonstration is planned for the Geary ranch, on peat soils. Here land which has been in grains will be planted to potatoes, and fertilized in an effort to find what fertilizer best meets the needs of this type soil.

"Often some of this work shows no results at all," Lawrence said, "but we continue to experiment until the right fertilizer is found for poor soil, and until we find just which of our soils need enriching under various crops."

Commission to Open Bids on Road April 25

SALEM, Ore., April 6.—The state highway commission at a meeting in Portland Friday, April 20, will open bids as follows:

Douglas county—Gardiner summit section of Roosevelt coast highway, 1.95 miles of grading. Gilliam county—Ramsey canyon road, 1.9 miles of grading and surfacing. Both projects to be awarded as one contract.

Klamath county—Beatty-Forrest boundary section of Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway, 21.3 miles of broken stone surfacing. Lane county—Bridge over McKenzie river on county road about 1 1/2 miles south of Coburg. This is a county project.

Umatilla county—Bridge over Umatilla river at Yokum on Yukum-Stage Galt market road. County project.

Union county—The furnishing of fabricated structural steel for a 70-foot steel span over Catherine creek near Hot Lake. County project.
