PORTLAND, Ore., May 10. (A. P.)—Al Karasick disposed of T. Higami in their light-heavyweight wrestling match last night after 30 minutes, 28 seconds of wrestling when he dumped Higami with a series of flying headlocks, the Japanese jiu jitsu expert being so badly shaken he was unable to continue.

The British Open, one of the historical classics of golf, gets under way today, with the usual large American contingent conspicuous mainly by their absence.

However, Walter Hagen always must be given a chance providing his recent moving picture activities haven't interfered with his putting touch. The "Hag" is supposed to have dropped a large bank roll in Florida through his ambitions to become a baseball magnate. The British Open title wouldn't do his depleted purse a bit of harm in his exhibition tours of the provinces this summer.

Abe Mitchell, the great British pro, playing in the same tournament, is in many respects the English counterpart of Hagen. He has a droll sense of humor, and is probably the most colorful golfer in the British Isles, with the exception of Ted Ray.

When he and George Duncan were in the U. S. last they were playing behind Irvin Cobb, the writer, and Wilbert Robinson, manager of the Dodgers, one day, each of whom is as large as a good-sized bunker.

Intersectional Baseball Clashes Lend Snap to Major Competition

The American League was ready today to join the National in a continuation of the intersectional warfare which has been waged on the two pennant fronts for a week. Rain and cold yesterday prevented action in the American league sector, where the Yankees and the Indians are engaged in a hand to hand struggle for the lead, but teams in the senior circuit enlivened the west with their battles.

The feature games saw Virgil Barnes pitch the Giants to a six to 0 victory over the Pirates in a game where the lead of the league was at stake and found Buzz McWeeney and Charlie Root locked in a rare pitching duel in Chicago. Brooklyn yielded to the Cubs, 2 to 1, in the twelfth.

The Braves lost their fifth straight game when Eppa Rixey emerged on top in a pitching battle against Genewich. The score was 4 to 1.

At St. Louis the Cardinals won as they pleased from the Phils, and they pleased, 7 to 1.

CONTRACTS FOR FIRE FIGHTING TO BE LET SOON

SALEM, Ore., May 10. (A. P.)—The United States forest service will this year let to commercial concerns contracts for the fire patrol of northwest forests. Heretofore this protection from fires has been taken care of by the government air service.

Advices relative to the new scheme were received yesterday by State Forester F. A. Elliott from the forest service. The patrol will not start until July 1 because of the condition of available funds. Federal funds will apply only to national forests and adjacent lands. State and private agencies will be unable to use the government planes on areas not adjacent to national forests.

The contracts probably will be let early in June. Tentatively it is planned that two planes shall operate on Puget Sound, one out of Portland and possibly one out of Wenatchee.
