BABE RUTH WILL GRAPPLERS WILL BETTER RECORD MEET SATURDAY

George Herman Ruth has a fine start toward realization of ambitions to make more home runs this season than ever.

The Babe slugged two balls into the grandstands at New York yesterday to aid the Yankees down the Detroit Tigers for the fourth straight day, 12 to 8, and put himself eight games ahead of the schedule that carried him to a new home run record of 60 last season.

Those two drives brought his total for the season to 11 in 26 games.

The Philadelphia Athletics kept within striking distance of the champions by downing Cleveland at Philadelphia 5 to 0. Jack Quinn pitched superlative ball, granting the invaders six hits. Tris Speaker hit three doubles to earn his day's salary.

Charlie Ruffing gave up but five hits as the Boston Red Sox ran their winning streak to four games at the expense of the St. Louis Browns, 3 to 1.

The Chicago White Sox made good use of their six hits and beat the Washington Senators, 3 to 2.

The Chicago Cubs moved into a tie with the Cincinnati Reds by downing the New York Giants for the fourth consecutive day, 10 to 7, while the Reds were losing to the Phillies, 5 to 3.

Home runs by Harper and Hafey gave the Cardinals all their runs in a 3 to 1 victory over the Boston Braves at St. Louis.

The Brooklyn Robins made it three in a row by beating the Pirates at Pittsburgh, 10 to 3.

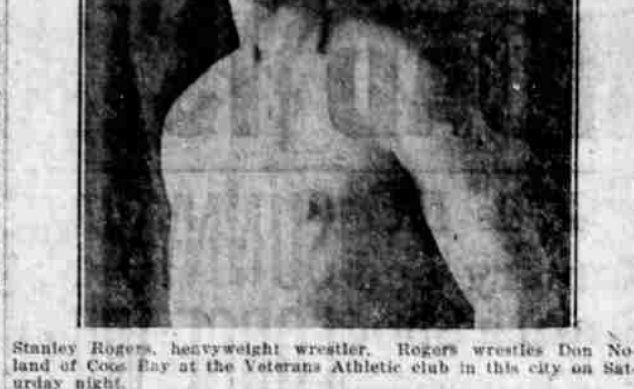

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A LAST WORD BEFORE ELECTION

I have worked since 1924 to have an honest cruise of timber made and put on the tax rolls. The fight has been a long one. Right now the assessor agrees to put the Cullison cruise on the tax rolls for 1928.

That is a victory after many discouraging periods for at times it looked like to mention timber cruising in this county almost meant high treason and he who mentioned it was in danger of his freedom and almost his life.

I have been a member of the County Court during all this fight and I want to say that there are indications that the fight is not over. If we are to have a square deal on taxation and get timber on the rolls that belongs there, it is no time to quit now, or even relax.

I am asking for renomination as County Commissioner because I know this job should be finished by men who are friendly at heart to the movement. To every taxpayer in this county I make an appeal this day to support my stand in having all property listed for taxation purposes. It sounds easy, but it has not proven so, and at present there are some clouds appearing on the horizon—there are active agencies still at work to prevent property being listed as it should be. You home owner, you merchant, you farmer—all of you are paying taxes on your stuff, then why not everybody pay as you are paying. I want to be elected to finish this job and finish it right. Are you with me? If so, vote for me in the primary and get your friends to do likewise.

On highways I want a word. A bond issue has been voted—half a million. It is easy to squander that money if heavy watch is not kept of every road unit. If we don't have proper inspectors and proper engineering just watch your public money frit away. This is another reason why I want to be re-nominated and re-elected; I know something about the roads and the plans that are now on. I know I can serve the county well for another term and see that a square deal is given in road work, as well as continuing the fight for all timber to go on the tax rolls.

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
