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HIGHWAY WORK IS UNDER WAY

Three Sectors of Lakeview Thoroughfare Are Under Contract

Three sections of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway are now in various stages of construction, probably the greatest building activity ever experienced on this road.

With three crews of work grading on the Devil's Garden section work is being pushed rapidly. Much of the clearing has been completed and the crew working east from Hwy has built a large section of grade.

On the grade mountain section of the road the grading crews of Dunn & Baker are surfacing the west slope of the mountain, and nearly all the gravel has been placed on the short sections of highway on top of the hill. On account of dampness work has not begun on the east slope road.

Work of putting the grade in condition for surfacing between Beatty and Hwy has begun, and the rock crusher will soon be placed. The only part of the highway not now under construction is the six-mile section from Lorenz mill to Dairy.
