These men are held in reserve to serve in time of war. Regular enlistments which will be ready within the near future will take in men between the ages of 18 and 30 years.

Sergeant Markowitz comes to Klamath Falls from Portland where he served as officer in charge for six years. For more than four years he served as sergeant of publicity.

During his 11 years of active service in the United States marines he has visited practically every foreign port of worth while mention.
