RANK OUTSIDER WINS ENGLISH DERBY CLASSIC

Unknown Horse, Placed at 33 to 1, First to Breast Tape

EPSON, Eng., June 7. (AP)—Duplicating the victory of his sire, Spion Kop Feistead, a rank outsider at 33 to 1, captured the historic English derby at Epsom Downs today leading in a field of 19 horses over the famous mile and a half course.

Flamingo, quoted at 9 to 2, was second, a length and a half behind the winner, while Black Watch, quoted at 33 to 1, was third six lengths behind Flamingo.

It was the 148th running of the great English classic and the usual great crowd of English racing enthusiasts was on hand at the course, some of the spectators having waited 24 hours for favorable positions.

Feistead, a bay colt by Spion Kop, out of Felkington, is owned by Sir Hugo Cunliffe-Owen. Feistead's victory was before a record crowd of nearly 1,000,000 spectators who massed historic Epsom Downs and it was estimated that an equivalent of at least \$15,000,000 were wagered on the race, including the great Calculus sweepstakes.

The tapes were broken three times before the colts could get away for a good start. Except for Royal Crusader who was left behind, Flamingo which was the second choice for the derby led all the way to Tottenham corner. Sunny Trace, which also was among the favorites pressed hard, but at the last quarter Feistead drew ahead and led the rest of the way winning fairly easily by a length and a half.

The official time was 2 minutes 35 2/5 seconds equalling the record made last year by Call Boy. Fairway, owned by Lord Derby and the favorite over the rest of the field was never up in front during the entire race and did not threaten the leaders.

So great was the crush of spectators that King George and Queen Mary had difficulty in getting to the royal box and had to leave their automobile and make their way through the crowds on foot to the doorway leading to their stand. The Prince of Wales, who wouldn't miss the derby for a good deal, had to fight his way through the throng with two big bobbies to reach the royal party, while the Duchess of York needed the assistance of the Duke to squeeze through the great jam of people.

It had drizzled during the morning but cleared up in time for the race.
