TEACHER WINS OUT IN COURT SALEM, Ore., June 12. (AP)—Martha F. Traver, school teacher of Washington county, is allowed the entire \$16,000 estate of the late Edward L. Naylor, notwithstanding a contest in court by numerous relatives of Naylor. This is the decree of the supreme court in an opinion written by Chief Justice Rand, affirming Judge George R. Bagley of the lower court for Washington county. Naylor and the teacher were engaged to marry. But on the night of December 8, 1919, he was mysteriously shot at his home near Forest Grove by an unidentified assailant. Nine years later he died from the wound, and during that period Miss Traver cared for him constantly. In return for this service he entered into a contract with her to will her his entire estate. Naylor died in 1926, without having made the will. His fiancée, however, was able to substantiate the contract to the satisfaction of both the circuit and supreme courts.

THREE WOMEN ARE INVOLVED IN CAR CRASH PORTLAND, Ore., June 12. (A. P.)—Three women, socially prominent were involved in an auto accident today at 27th and Hancock streets. Mrs. William Donohue lost control of her heavy car when her coat sleeve caught on the gas throttle. She crashed into the side of a car operated by Miss Katherine Graef. Miss Graef's car careened to the sidewalk, while Mrs. Donohue was unable to stop until she drove onto a lawn. Mrs. Mary Ekbert, Nampa, Idaho, who is visiting her niece, Miss Graef, suffered face lacerations and a fractured wrist.

SALEM, Ore., June 12. (AP)—Oregon, outside of Portland, suffered loss from 126 fires during May, but only three caused a loss of \$10,000 or more, according to the May report of Clara A. Lee, state fire marshal and insurance commissioner. The heaviest loss was at Baker where a lumber plant, lumber and machinery were destroyed with a loss of \$165,000. A saw mill fire in Klamath county caused a \$40,000 loss. A mercantile building and contents were burned at Medford.
