TECUMSEH, Ontario, June 14. (AP)—E. F. Woodward of Houston, Texas, shattered the record for consecutive hits on Amateur Trapshooting association registered targets today when he ran a three-day string of shattered birds to 506 without a miss.

Woodward's mark was made during the second day of competition in the grand international trap shooting tournament here.

He had run 159 straight targets at Joliet, Ill., on Saturday, 200 here yesterday and 156 more today before he shot over a straight away target for his first miss.

The old record of 455 was set last year by Guy Dering, president of the Amateur Trapshooting association. Dering was an interested spectator when the record was smashed today.

Nicholas Murray Butler Declines to Engage in Contest With Upshaw

KANSAS CITY, June 14. (U. P.)—Former Congressman William D. Upshaw of Georgia is a democrat but he wants to say something about prohibition here before the republican convention leaves.

He has challenged Nicholas Murray Butler of Columbia university to debate here on prohibition, which he supports and Butler decries.

Once before he challenged Butler to debate the dry law, but the university head replied that since he had the choice of weapons he would use silence.

In the challenge, issued in the form of an open letter, Upshaw said he was sorry he had no chance to reply to the wet educator when the latter advocated a modification plank in the G. O. P. platform.

"I believe we could furnish the convention delegates and the citizens of Kansas City a first-class bill of entertainment while each of us honestly contended for the clashing faiths within us," he wrote.

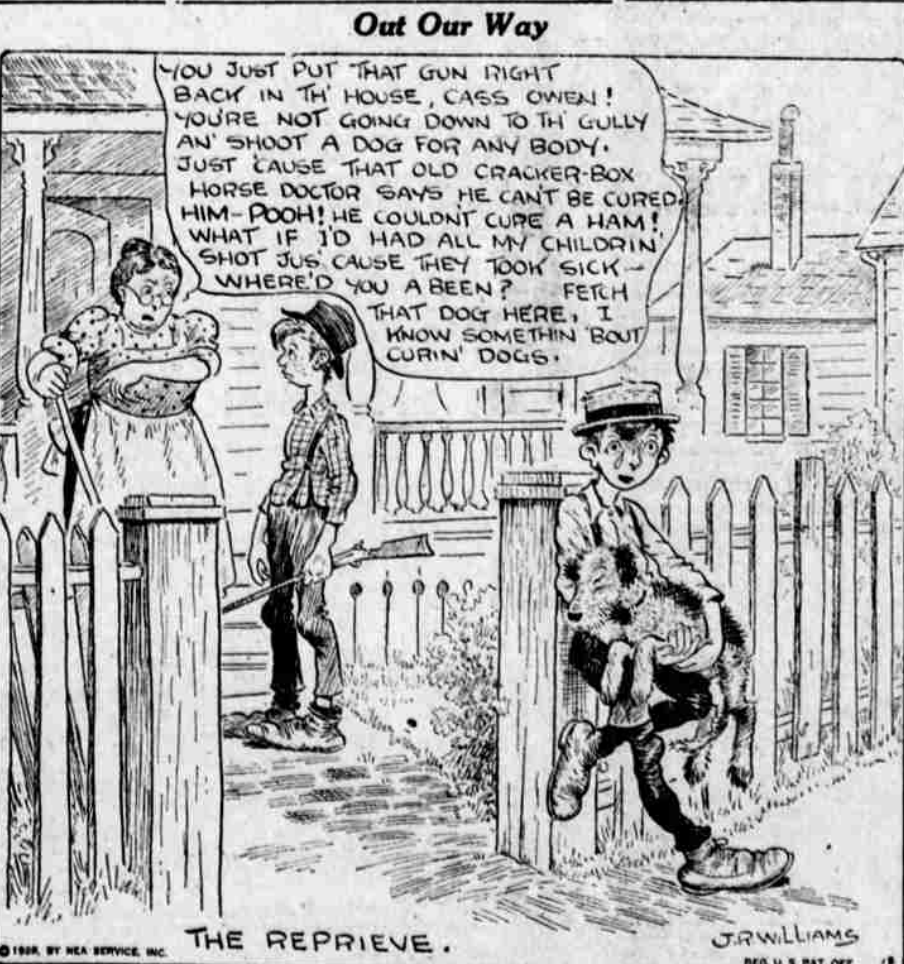
