Weyerhaeuser To Establish Camp in July

Weyerhaeuser Timber company will establish a camp of about 50 men in the vicinity of Keno around the Fourth of July. It was announced last night by officials of the company.

No men are needed, the officials announced, to fill out the quota, as contractors will be employed in the work, and the contractors selected have full crews.

At present, work on clearing right-of-way is progressing rapidly, but no grade has been put up as yet.

The new camp will do grading only, it was announced. No track will be laid until later in the season. The company expects to extend its logging line to Spencer creek this year, it was announced.

CHARGE LAWYER WITH CROOKED DEAL IN SALEM

SALEM, Ore., June 21, (AP)—Obtaining money by false pretenses is charged against J. A. Anderson, claiming to be a California lawyer in a warrant for arrest issued here yesterday. Anderson, accompanied by E. J. Frazier of Eugene, is accused of persuading stockholders of the insolvent Cosmopolitan chain stores to pay him 10 percent of their subscriptions as fees to start litigation against the company.

The whereabouts of Anderson is not known. Frazier has been about Salem for several days, and on Tuesday told state corporation commissioner McAllister that he would pay back the money obtained. He turned over \$500 to McAllister as part of the amount. It is believed the two men collected about \$1500.

The charges against Anderson are based on affidavits obtained by McAllister from some of the stockholders.

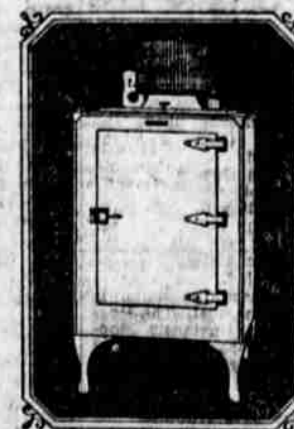
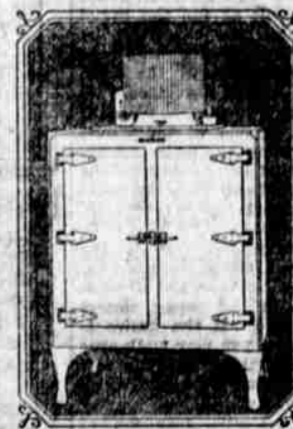
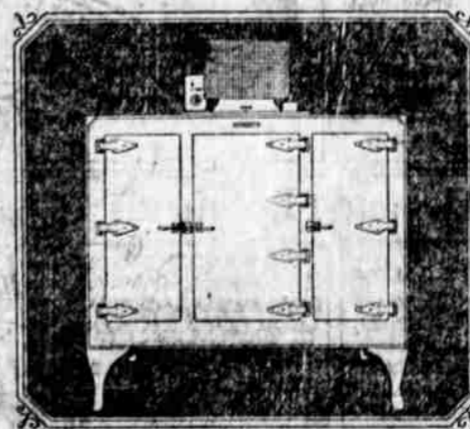
