# PORTLAND WINS COURT APPEAL

SALEM, Ore., June 26. (AP)—The supreme court today handed down an opinion holding against the numerous plaintiffs in the case of W. J. Gregor and others, appellants, against the city of Portland, in which an attempt was made to enjoin the city from collecting the amount assessed against them as benefits of the Interstate Avenue.

The opinion was written by Justice Coshaw and affirms Judge Ashby Dixon of the lower court for Multnomah county. The opinion holds that the improvement is of general benefit to the property owners along the thoroughfare, that the council complied fully with the city charter and concludes as follows: "The distribution of the benefits and
