Father-in-Law of H. Hoover Passes Today

MONTEREY, Cal., July 18. (A.P.)—This historic city lost one of its first citizens when C. D. Henry, father-in-law of Herbert Hoover, Republican presidential nominee, succumbed to heart trouble and the infirmities of old age, at Placerville in the high Sierras. He was 84 years old.

It was 36 years ago, in 1892, that Henry, then in the prime of life, came to Monterey with his wife, Florence, and two daughters, Lou and Jean. He came to guide a group of local businessmen in the formation of Monterey's first bank, the Bank of Monterey. Henry came from Los Angeles and under the original understanding was to have merely assisted in the launching of the bank, but he remained on as cashier and it was not until 1920 when the Valley Bank acquired the Bank of Monterey, that he gave up active business life.

Both of Henry's daughters spent their girlhood days in Monterey and attended public schools here. Miss Lou Henry, who is now Mrs. Herbert Hoover, later entered Stanford university while Jean studied music abroad.
