"BIG BAM" OF YANKEES SAVES ANOTHER GAME

Ruth Propels Ou 37th and 38th Home Runs Yesterday

Babe Ruth is nothing if not obdurate. He has slugged three homers in the past two days and they've won two ball games for the New York Yankees.

On Wednesday Wiley Moore needed three runs in the last inning if he was to save himself from defeat at the hands of the up and coming Chicago White Sox. The Yanks got two men on base and they scored ahead of Babe Ruth when he slammed homer No. 36 high and dry in the right field stands.

Against the same White Sox yesterday Herb Pennock was unsteady most of the way but the Babe pulled him through to a six to four victory by propelling his thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth circuit clouts into the stands, each time with Earle Combs on base.

These two Ruthian drives put the "Big Bam" twenty-seven games, twenty-nine days and eight home runs ahead of his 1927 schedule when he slammed 60 for a new record.

The Athletics shaved half a game off the champions' lead by turning back the Detroit Tigers in both ends of a double bill, 2 to 0 and 4 to 3, the latter in 11 innings.

Owen Carroll pitched the Detroit Tigers to a 9 to 3 triumph over the Washington Senators in the first game of a double header but Milt Gaston reversed matters in the second, the Senators walking off with an easy 7 to 2 win.

Ed Morris registered his 13th pitching victory of the year as the Boston Red Sox evened the series with Cleveland, 3 to 2 in 11 innings.

Over in the National league the St. Louis Cardinals added more woes to the unluckiest Phillies. The Cards just barely nosed out a 6 to 5 verdict that marked the Phils' eleventh straight defeat.

Meanwhile the Brooklyn Dodgers snapped a nine-game winning streak rolled up by the defending league champions, the Pittsburgh Pirates, 3 to 0. Doug McWeeny had a slight edge on the young Pirate southpaw, Fred Fussell, the Dodger harrier accounting for the last two of his team's runs in the ninth when he drove in two men with a single.

Boston finally managed to end a nine-game losing streak by pounding out a 9 to 4 verdict over the Cincinnati Reds. The Reds called upon four pitchers to stem the tide but it was to no avail.

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Tennis Stars Minus Tilden Gain Victory

AUTEUIL, France, July 20. (A.P.)—America's Davis cup tennis players, minus Tilden, produced a great surprise today by winning the first two singles matches of the interzone final contest with Italy, both in straight sets.

After Francis T. Hunter had defeated Placido Gaslini in the first match by 6-1, 6-1, 6-0, John Hennessey downed Baron Humbert De Morpurgo, 6-4, 7-5, 6-2.

Tennis drama of the highest sort was packed into the Hennessey-Morpurgo match as the young American, after a poor start, fought his way up from behind in both the first and second sets to win them and then swept the third and deciding set at top speed.

The overwhelming victory of Hunter in the first match exceeded the hopes of American supporters but it remained for Hennessey to provide the real upset of the day by downing De Morpurgo who was heavily favored to win both his singles matches.

The New Zealand blacksmith has been accused by some of being ready and willing to sit out any of his training periods at the slightest provocation, but there seems to be some sense to his decision to do no work today. Hennessey never was a great shark at mathematics, but several hours with a stub pencil and a primary arithmetic convinced him that a steady grind between now and next Thursday in the prevailing heat would fit him to meet not Gene Tunney but Sammy Mandel at the most.

The challenger is meditating upon sage words expressed here by Jack Kearns, who must be credited with knowing a thing or two about fighting, regardless of the opinion of Jack Dempsey. Kearns expressed himself as surprised at Hennessey's condition, and remarked with a knowing nod that that condition would win next Thursday's battle.

Pressed for particulars, Kearns with characteristic modesty disclaimed any intention of choosing Thomas as the probable winner over the champion, but said: "This man is no set up."
