mate the strength of the Sandino band at 150 men and believe that, since the surrender of more than 500 natives within the last two weeks, it is the only insurgent group now in the Nicaraguan interior.

While the marines outnumber Sandino's men, their operations are made extremely difficult and perilous by the character of the terrain. Like Sandino the marine detachments in many places are cut off by land from their bases of supplies. Airplanes carry their provisions and drop them by parachutes, and in some instances the rivers are used.

Dispatches picture Sandino as fearful for his personal safety, and on his guard against treachery among his followers, permit-

ting only those who are known to him to enter his camp.
