GEORGE NOLAN SENTENCED TO TERM IN PEN

Eighteen months in the state penitentiary was the sentence meted out to George Nolan, who was found guilty in the circuit court last Tuesday of injuring a person when driving an automobile while under the influence of liquor. Nolan, it was held, drove his car into the back end of a Copco truck last June, breaking both legs of Joe Lusk, Copco employe, who was riding on the rear end of the truck. Nolan immediately drove on without ascertaining what injuries he had done, but was arrested 15 minutes later on Main street in a very intoxicated condition, testimony showed.
